PALM SUNDAY-- THE PASSION OF CHRIST

This Sunday commemorates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. As crowds waved palms and spread their cloaks on His path, they shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David.' Only a few days later they shouted, "Crucify Him." Why did they change their cry? Do we imitate their change of heart by pretending to be followers of Jesus when it is easy, but betray Him when the going gets rough?

Holy Week, the holiest of weeks in the year, is the time to reflect on the depth of our faith and trust in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In silence and prayer we take time out of our busy life to enable the deep inner voice of our own true self to be heard. When that inner voice is not heard, we cannot attain the spiritual peace that comes from being perfectly at one with the true self. Life can be miserable and exhausting when we leave no room to listen to God's Spirit, to ponder God's Love for us. May this Holy Week be spent in more solitude and silence, without TV, smartphones, constant noise in our life so that we can reach true peace in the realization that we are by Baptism united to Christ. He is truly present and can transform us.

THE PALMS

Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into Church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year. Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create ashes that will be used in the following year's Ash Wednesday observance. The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.
