FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

While it may seem odd, I look forward to Lent all year because it permits me the luxury of meditating on the rich tradition of lament that is often forgotten or ignored all together. Lament is the action of truly mourning the incompleteness of our lives, our society and our world in the sight of God. There is a wealth of emotions bubbling in the reading from Chronicles as the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple has effectively terminated the sacred worship space of the Jewish people. Psalm 137 reiterates the destruction and we are drawn into the devastation through the psalmist's plaintive words.

John's Gospel shows a way out of the lament and devastation: "God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son." Love is the path out of lament and devastation. Through this ultimate sacrifice on our behalf, we become people of the light forever abandoning the darkness that threatens to overshadow hope.

In a few days, we will set our faces to Jerusalem, to liturgically journey with Jesus during his passion, death and resurrection. Today, we witness the second Scrutiny for the Catechumens. The scrutinies are rites for spiritual self-searching. We as church support the elect with our prayers as they journey toward the Cross.

- Do I work to protect the dignity of others when it is being threatened?
- Am I committed to both protecting human life and to ensuring that every human being is able to live in dignity?

GO TO CONFESSION! EXPERIENCE THE LOVING MERCY OF GOD OUR FATHER!

The Sacrament of Penance, one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church, is a special gift from God. It is the **SACRAMENT OF CONVERSION**, because it makes sacramentally present Jesus' call to conversion, the first step in returning to the Father from whom one has strayed by sin. It is the **SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION**, since the disclosure or confession of sins to a priest is an essential element of the sacrament.

It is the **SACRAMENT OF FORGIVENESS**, since by the sacramental absolution, God grants the penitent "pardon and peace." It is the **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION** because it imparts to the sinner the love of God who reconciles. He who lives by God's merciful love is ready to respond to the Lord's call, "Go, first be reconciled to your brother." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* #1423)

God's loving mercy flows over a contrite heart when the priest prays the words of absolution used in the Latin Rite:

God the Father of mercies, through the death and the resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to Himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins, through the ministry of the Church, may God give you pardon and peace and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. (CCC # 1449)

Families are encouraged to pray at home. All Confirmation and First Communion students undergoing their sacrament preparation are strongly recommended to participate in the reciting of the Stations of the Cross before Mass. This will help increase, strengthen and expand the teachings of Jesus as you prepare to receive the Sacrament(s).
