KATERI CIRCLE

In our Church of St. John Francis Regis, some forty parishioners have joined together in the KATERI CIRCLE for the purpose of evangelization, living out and spreading the Gospel of Jesus. They have formed a prayer group to share faith and to join together in works of charity within the community of Akwesasne. Members of the Kateri Circle are most generous in all aspects of parish life -- praying with grieving families in time of loss of loved ones, serving as Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist in taking Holy Communion to sick and homebound elders, providing ongoing maintenance of the Church, participating in the Parish Council, Finance Council, Food Pantry, Ushering at Mass and volunteering each week to assist the elders at IAHKHIHSOTHA. Through fund-raising activities, they enable members to attend the annual Tekakwitha Conference, while also aiding the Hogansburg Volunteer Fire Department.

Officers of the Kateri Circle are: President, Debbie Thomas; Vice-President, Caroline Peters; Secretary, Jackie Arquette, and Treasurer, Vickie Phillips. They welcome new members to join the Kateri Circle for prayer and works of mercy.

The Kateri Circle is registered with the Tekakwitha Conference and sends representatives each year to the national conference where Catholics from Native American Tribes throughout the United States and Canada gather for prayer, liturgies, workshops, cultural sharing and growth in faith. This year, the Lummi Tribe will host the Kateri Conference in Tacoma, Washington in July. That is the home of the young boy, Jake Fintbonner, whose cure from a pernicious infection through the intercession of St. Kateri, provided the miracle needed for her canonization on October 20, 2012.

The Tekakwitha Conference was incorporated in 1979, with financial support and encouragement from the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions. Prior to that in 1939, Bishop Aloysius Muench of Fargo, ND, had begun meetings of Catholic Plains Indians and missionaries to discuss pastoral concerns. In time, Native-Americans from all over the United States and Canada began to unite to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Mohawks of Akwesasne were among the first to form a Kateri Circle whose mission was to promote the cause of canonization of our very own saint.

Last weekend the Kateri Circle presented a mass celebration of St. Kateri's feast. Father Henry Sands from Washington, D.C. and Father Jerome Pastores concelebrated the 4 PM Saturday Mass. The Mohawk Choir, Sweetgrass Purification Rite and Four Directions Prayer enhanced the liturgy.
