TRINITY SUNDAY - MAY 27, 2018

GLORY BE TO THE FATHER AND TO THE SON AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT AS IT WAS IN THE BEGINNING, IS NOW, AND EVER SHALL BE. WORLD WITHOUT END. AMEN.

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the **FEAST OF THE HOLY TRINITY** is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but **one**, **eternal**, **incomprehensible God!** The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: *Lord*, *I believe*, *help my weak faith*.

Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we profess our belief in the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity, as well as in the Redemption won for us by Jesus through His Crucifixion. Let us pray fervently and reverently: IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

<u>WELCOME TO ST. REGIS, BISHOP NOEL SIMARD OF</u> THE DIOCESE OF VALLEYFIELD!

This weekend we express our gratitude to Bishop Noel Simard of the Diocese of Valleyfield, who comes to confirm in faith the parishioners who have been preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. This Sacrament is conferred through the anointing with chrism on the forehead, which is done by the laying on of the hand and through the words, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

The Bishop invokes the outpouring of the Spirit in these words:

All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit, you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide.

Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence.

Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Confirmation, like Baptism, imprints a spiritual mark or indelible character on the Christian's soul. For this reason, one can receive this sacrament only once in life. Ordinarily, the Bishop confers the Sacrament of Confirmation. However, this Sacrament is so important, that if a Christian child is in danger of death before being confirmed, any priest should give him the Sacrament of Confirmation. (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1314). We encourage any baptized Catholic, who has never received this wonderful sacrament, to sign up to prepare for next year's program.
