**SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST
(CORPUS CHRISTI)**

**"I Myself am the living Bread come down from heaven. If
anyone eats this Bread, he shall live forever; the Bread I
will give is My Flesh for the life of the world." (Jn.6:51)**

On this **Feast of Corpus Christi**, we proclaim our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We also proclaim that the same Jesus lives within each one of us who are baptized into His Body, the Church, of which we are members.

This is the theological mystery we call **communion**. We call the reception of the Eucharist, **Holy Communion**. The Christian faith is about relationship with the Father, in and through His Son Jesus, through the Holy Spirit. The world in which we live is the world that God loves so much that He sent His Son - to save, recreate and transform it .

Today we have the Corpus Christi procession to symbolize the ongoing redemptive mission of Jesus Christ and our participation in it. In the Holy Eucharist we receive the Divine Host, Jesus the Christ. We are invited to become a living monstrance, carrying the Lord within us into the real world by sharing His love in word and deed. When we process - we proclaim by symbolic action that the Lord continues to come into the world, through us, His members.
