THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
"YOUR FAITH HAS SAVED YOU. GO IN PEACE."

The story of the healing of the bleeding woman is sandwiched between the beginning and the ending of the story of the raising of the daughter of Jairus, the synagogue official. Both stories declare the desire of Jesus and His Father to bring new experience of life to those who seem to be at death's door. Both stories show the power of God's love and our need to have faith and trust in Him.

The woman with the hemorrhage had such faith that she believed she would be healed if she could just touch the garment of Jesus. Jairus believed that Jesus could cure his twelve-year old daughter even though she had been declared dead.

Do we have that kind of faith? At Holy Mass we are present at the reenactment of Calvary, as the priest pronounces the words of Consecration, "***This is My Body. This is My Blood. Do this in remembrance of Me.***" Then, in Holy Communion we don't merely touch a garment, but we receive into our heart the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Do we really believe? ***Do we take time to thank Him?***

FEAST OF ST. THOMAS, APOSTLE

St. Thomas's love for Jesus was clearly expressed in (John 11:5-16.) When Jesus was planning to return to Judea, the disciples warned Him that the Jews were seeking to stone him to death. However, Thomas replied, "Let us also go that we may die with Him." At the Last Supper (John 14:1-7) Thomas could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said, "I will come again and will take you to Myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way where I am going." Thomas's question "How can we know the way?" caused Jesus to answer, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." When Jesus appeared to the disciples after His Resurrection from the dead, Thomas was absent. Later in hearing that Jesus was alive, Thomas doubted and said that he would not believe unless he could touch the wounds of Jesus. When Jesus appeared again and called the doubting Thomas to Him, Thomas fell on his knees proclaiming, "My Lord and my God." Jesus then declared that those are most blessed who do not see Him but do believe in Him.
