SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JULY 29, 2018

Again this Sunday, we witness the compassion of Jesus as He feeds thousands with five barley loaves of bread and two fish. This Gospel story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes foretells the gift of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, the night before Jesus died on the cross for our salvation. When we read the Gospel of John on Holy Thursday, we heard the story of the washing of the disciples' feet. In both stories about the Eucharist—the washing of the disciples' feet and the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes— John teaches us that the Eucharist is an **action**. Our word **Eucharist** is taken from the Greek language and describes an action: "to give thanks." In the Eucharist we are fed by Jesus himself, and we are sent to serve others.

John's Gospel notes the detail that the bread blessed and shared with the crowd are barley loaves. This is the food of the poor. It reminds us that God feeds and nourishes us, fulfilling our physical needs, as well as our spiritual ones. In the Eucharist, we are sent to serve the poorest among us.

Perhaps this week we can be conscious that Jesus gives Himself in so many ways in our lives, not merely enough for our needs but an abundance! Do we give Him thanks? Eucharist is the greatest possible THANKSGIVING as Jesus Christ offers Himself to the Father. God transforms our gifts, making bread and wine the very Body and Blood of Jesus. We also offer ourselves in this exchange, and we, too, are transformed by the Eucharist. *Anyone who neglects to receive the Eucharist is spiritually starving to death.*

FEAST OF ST. ALPHONSUS LIGOURI, FOUNDER OF THE REDEMPTORISTS

The past is no longer yours; the future is not yet in your power. You have only the present wherein to do good.' "He who trusts himself is lost. He who trusts in God can do all things." "Acquire the habit of speaking to God as if you were alone with Him, familiarly and with confidence and love, as to the dearest and most loving of friends." These are a few bits of spiritual counsel from Saint Alphonsus Liguori CSsR, whose feast day is August 1st. He was an Italian Catholic bishop, spiritual writer, composer, musician, artist, poet, lawyer, scholastic philosopher, and theologian. St. Alphonsus founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. He published nine editions of his Moral Theology in his lifetime, in addition to other devotional and ascetic works and letters. He greatly loved Our Lady of the Perpetual Help.

JULY 31st - FEAST OF ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA

St. Ignatius Lovola was born in 1491, one of 13 children of a family of minor nobility in northern Spain. As a young man Ignatius Loyola was inflamed by the ideals of courtly love and knighthood and dreamed of doing great deeds of chivalry. However, he was wounded by a cannon ball and had those dreams squashed. He was bored during long days of recovery and asked for some books to read. He was given the LIVES OF THE SAINTS. As he studied the ways such human beings could become holy and pleasing to God by imitating Jesus, Ignatius began to wonder how he might become a saint. With God's grace he prayed and studied, and was drawn to form the Society of Jesus. Many men began to embrace a life of prayer and discipline, spreading devotion to the holy name of JESUS, eventually becoming missionaries of His Gospel. These Jesuits .became great educators in the Catholic faith and missionaries to every corner of the world.

Here at St. Regis Mission it was the Jesuit Fathers who accompanied the Catholic Mohawks of Caughnawaga to found St. Regis Mission in 1752. On this Feast of St. Ignatius, let us pray for all those Jesuits we remember who labored on this Reservation. Bring to mind Father Joseph Bourget, Father Michael Jacobs, Father Francis Arsenault, Father LaVigne, Father Bazinet, Father Hanlon, Father Egan, Father Fleig, Father George Belgarde, as well as the dear Jesuit Brothers Savard and Girard who spent years of prayer and labor among us. May God reward all of them! Could we be brave enough to pray St. Ignatius's SUSCIPE to let God's Will be done in us? Take, O Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and whole will. You have given me all that I am, and all that I possess. I surrender it all to You, that You may dispose of it according to Your Will.. Give me only Your love and your grace, with these I will be rich enough, and will have no more to desire.
