#### **FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, JULY 8, 2018**

The Scriptural readings this Sunday remind us of the cost of discipleship--the problems faced when we try to follow God's Will. God describes the people to whom the prophet Ezechiel was sent as "rebellious". They not only refused to listen to God's messengers--Jeremiah, Isaiah, Elijah, Elisha -- but killed them. St. Paul also suffered every kind of persecution, eventually martyrdom, but God told him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." He boasted, "I am content with weakness, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ, for whenever I am weak, then I am strong."

Jesus found hardened faces and stubborn hearts when he went to his hometown. He was hampered from doing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. He was proclaiming the kingdom of God, the presence of God among them, but all that they saw was a carpenter. They asked him where He got all His wisdom. Some of the saddest words are in the Gospel, "And Jesus could do no deed of power there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and cured them. And Jesus was amazed at their unbelief." He did not expect this rejection by neighbors and friends. He teaches us the cost of Christian discipleship.

God's prophets were put to death. The Son of God's disciples were martyred. The blood of martyrs became the seed of the Church and for over two thousand years people follow Christ. His Gospel tells us that God's will is for us to LOVE one another. "Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. Pray for those who calumniate you." That is a hard maxim, but we can believe with St. Paul, "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me."

### ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA, PATRON SAINT OF ECOLOGY AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Like St. Francis of Assisi, St. Kateri Tekakwitha had great love for Mother Earth and for all God's creation. They remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. "Praise be you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with colored flowers and herbs."

Pope Francis in his encyclical, LAUDATO SI (Care for our Common Home) has given us valuable insights:


- We are not "masters" of our planet, God our Creator is! He made all things and judged them to be "good".
- The natural resources of the earth are limited. They are to be cared for, safeguarded, not abused, wasted, or treated as mere for-profit commodities for personal aggrandizement.
- A lack of appreciation for the goodness of creation and the dignity of all people lies at the root of the ecological crisis facing the world. The environmental challenges we face represent a spiritual and moral test.
- "Ecological conversion" i.e. a change of minds, hearts, and attitudes, is necessary if we are to reverse the trend of environmental deterioration and failure to live sustainably on the earth.

We pray to St. Kateri to show us how to become good stewards of Mother Earth, "Help us to be good stewards of God's creation: living persons, animals and plants, rivers and forests, lands and seas."

Although Canada's liturgical calendar designates the feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha on the date of her death, April 17th, the United States liturgical calendar celebrates her feast on July 14th. We can celebrate our Mohawk saint on both dates! Usually there is a special celebration at Auriesville, the birthplace of Kateri, and at Fonda, where she was baptized.

At an early age, Tekakwitha knew that she wanted to dedicate her life to Jesus. At age 18, in secret, she began instructions in the Catholic Faith by the Jesuit Fathers. She was subjected to unfair accusations and decided to journey northward to the Christian community of St. Francis Xavier in Caughnawaga. In 1677 she made her First Holy Communion, and on the feast of the Annunciation in 1679, she made a vow of perpetual virginity and also offered herselt to the Blessed Mother Mary to accept her as her daughter. Kateri taught prayers to the children, cared for the elderly and sick, and was known for her deep love of the Blessed Sacrament and the Cross of Jesus.

Kateri bore the cross of illness with sincere love. Her last words before death on April 17, 1680 were, "Jesus. Mary. I love You."
