*'No one can come to Me unless the Father Who sent Me draw  
them; and I will raise that person up on the last day...Very truly  
I tell you. Whoever believes has eternal life.*

***I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE."***

As we pray the Nicene Creed at Holy Mass this weekend, let  
us increase our faith in Jesus, the Bread of Life. as we pray - " I  
believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of  
God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light  
from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made,  
consubstantial with the Father, through Him all things were  
made. For us men and for our salvation, He came down from  
heaven and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary  
and became man."

This is the JESUS CHRIST in Whom we believe. Jesus is the  
true Bread of Life. Only the person who eats this bread, the  
one who assimilates Jesus' revelation as vital bread will be  
able to have eternal life forever.

**REVERENCE FOR THE HOLY EUCHARIST,  
THE BREAD OF LIFE**

The story is told that St. Philip Neri, a great lover of Jesus in  
the Holy Eucharist, was saddened because one woman of his  
congregation always raced down the aisle, right out the door of  
church after she had received the Sacred Host. She seemed to  
have no time for silent adoration or thanksgiving for Holy  
Communion. St. Philip wondered if the woman really believed  
in the Divine Presence within her. He decided to give her  
gentle reminder. He asked his altar server to carry the lighted  
processional candle behind that woman all the way down the  
aisle and outdoors to her car, so that Jesus would receive the  
thanksgiving and reverence He deserves. That woman was  
awakened in faith in the Real Presence within her after the  
reception of Communion. Thereafter, she even remained in  
church after Mass to praise and thank God for His wondrous  
gift. What a great change she experienced in her life and that  
of her family!

**SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF  
MARY INTO HEAVEN**

***"Immaculate Mary, your praises we sing. You reign  
now in heaven with Jesus, our King."***

The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body  
was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in  
a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother  
of God." The document is written in the voice of the apostle  
John, to whom Jesus on the Cross had entrusted the care  
of His mother in the words, "Mother, behold your son; Son,  
behold your mother." The document recounts the death,  
laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin.  
Tradition variously places Mary's death at Jerusalem or at  
Ephesus, where John was living.

From early years, Christians traditionally celebrated Mary's  
Assumption. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII,  
exercising papal infallibility, declared in an Apostolic  
Constitution, *Munificentissimus Deus*, that it is a dogma of  
the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever  
Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life,  
was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

What can we learn from this feast? As Mother of God, Mary  
bore the Son of God in her womb. As a temple of the Holy  
Spirit, her body was holy and taken up into heaven to be  
with God forever in eternity. In Baptism every Christian's  
body becomes a holy temple of the Holy Spirit, and on the  
last day will rise from the dead. When we pray the  
Creed, we end with the words, "I believe in the resurrection  
of the body and life everlasting." Amen.

**The Church's Teaching about CREMATION**

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2300-2301  
states: "The bodies of the dead must be treated with respect  
and charity, in faith and hope of the Resurrection. The  
burial of the dead is a corporal work of mercy; it honors the  
children of God, who are temples of the Holy Spirit.  
Autopsies can be morally permitted for legal inquests or  
scientific research. The free gift of organs after death is  
legitimate and can be meritorious. The Church permits  
cremation, provided that it does not demonstrate a denial of  
faith in the resurrection of the body."

**PRAYER FOR HEALING**

Lord Jesus Christ, You who traveled throughout  
Galilee healing the sick, enabling the blind to see  
and the lame to walk, bring healing to Your people  
who need it this day. Grant relief to the ones who  
suffer pain and physical torment. Give peace to  
those whose minds are tortured by mental illness  
and anxiety. Comfort those who are alone in their  
suffering; may Your people reach out to them and to  
all the needy this day. Send Your grace to the  
caregivers that they might be gentle and effective  
agents of Your loving mercy. May our suffering be  
joined with Yours to bring healing throughout the  
world.
