**OCTOBER 14, 2018**

**“Go, sell what you have and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.”**

St. Paul tells us that “the Word of God is living and effective, sharper than a two-edged sword.” Today’s “Word of God” reminds us to pray for the Spirit of Wisdom which is more precious than gold or silver because all good things come with this gift. God has a unique plan for each of His children – a plan for eternal happiness. The wisdom to discern what is good and what is bad can only be achieved through prayer, an encounter with God.

The rich young man in today’s Gospel meets Jesus and asks what is necessary to attain eternal life. He hears the answer, but chooses to stay with his earthly goods, and walks away. **FEAST OF ST. TERESA OF AVILA – OCTOBER 15**

Teresa of Avila, Spain, was a Carmelite nun who proved that a woman in union with God in prayer could accomplish great reforms in the Church. Despite poor health and the tremendous opposition of critics, she reformed her religious order, founded sixteen convents, and wrote some of the most inspiring classics on Prayer – “The Way of Perfection”, “The Interior Castle.” She gives us good advice: **“Let nothing disturb you, nothing frighten you. All things are passing. God alone never changes.”**

**FEAST OF ST. MARGUERITE D’YOUVILLE – OCTOBER 16**

Marguerite D’Youville (1701-1771), was a Canadian widow left with three small children and huge debts incurred by her husband’s liquor trade with the Indians of Quebec. Despite ridicule and poverty, she was compassionate and generous. Trusting in Divine Providence, she founded the Sisters of Charity of Montreal, the Grey Nuns, who reached out to the poor of Canada and the U.S.A. The Grey Nuns founded Hepburn Hospital, St. Joseph’s Orphanage and Nursing Homes, St. Mary’s and Holy Cross schools in Ogdensburg and Champlain Valley Hospital in Plattsburgh, where many from St. Regis have received care. St. Marguerite shows us how God can do great works through a woman who forgets herself and surrenders her life to God.

**FEAST OF ST. IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH – OCTOBER 17**

Bishop of Antioch, Syria, St. Ignatius was martyred in Rome in 108 A.D. He realized that those who received the Holy Eucharist, the Bread of Life, must be ready to die for Jesus. Permit me to imitate my suffering God ... I am God’s wheat and I shall be ground by the teeth of beasts, that I may become the pure bread of Christ."

**FEAST OF ST. LUKE, EVANGELIST – OCTOBER 18**

St. Luke, a physician and companion of St. Paul, was the inspired writer of one of the four Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. His *Infancy Narratives* provide the basis for our Christmas and of Mary’s *Magnificat*, a beautiful picture of Mary’s soul. St. Luke painted early icons of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for which he is known as patron of artists. He is also patron of physicians and surgeons. We pray for our doctors today!
