OCTOBER 21, 2018 WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

I AM A MISSION ON THIS EARTH!

Pope Francis in His address to all Christians, especially to young people reminds us. "We are not in this world by our own choice. Every man and woman is a mission. All who have received the Sacrament of Baptism have received the mission to bring the Gospel of God's Love to everyone. The heart of the Church's mission is the infectiousness of love, where joy and enthusiasm become the expression of a new found meaning and fulfillment in life. The spread of the faith "by attraction", he says, calls for hearts that are open and expanded by love.

**"No one is so poor as to be unable to give what they have,
but first and foremost what they are."**

The Gospel this Sunday gives us some advice on the way to become a Missionary. "**Whoever wishes to be first among you must be the slave of all. For the Son of Man came, not to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.**"

James and John ask Jesus to give them preferential treatment – to have honored places at His right and left when He enters into glory. The other disciples become jealous. They too want the first places. They are thinking of power and glory and praise, while Jesus is thinking of His mission – to go to His death on the cross for the salvation of humankind. He shows us that the authority of God is in loving. It is in silence. It is in caring. It is in accepting. The Father is a giver, not a taker.

On this Mission Sunday, we are sent out by Jesus – not to try to convince the world that we are right and they are wrong, that we have the truth and they do not. This is far from the thought of GOD. He sends us into this world to listen and to heal, to care and to reach out. We are sent into this world to learn how to love as God loves. God gives His only begotten Son that we might understand true love offered on the Cross for the remission of our sins and re-enacted on the altar in every Sacrifice of the Mass. To be a true missionary is to live the Mass!
