THE PARISH TRAVELING FAMILY ROSARY

The St. Regis Mission Parish has received from Larry and Theresa Crowe of St. Raphael's Parish of Heuvelton, a large homemade wooden rosary to travel from one family to another each week, to pray especially for our families, for the poor, and for vocations. Deacon Adam Crowe, age 25, died suddenly of a brain hemorrhage just a few weeks before his ordination to the priesthood at St. Mary's Cathedral. Adam loved the Rosary and his parents have been carving parish "traveling" rosaries for the parishes of the diocese. Already, sixty-three parishes have a "traveling rosary."

Father Jerome will give a special blessing to our parish rosary at Mass on the feast of the Holy Rosary, so that it will be ready to travel around our parish to unite our families in prayer to Our Blessed Mother. Those willing to use the rosary for their Family Rosary for a week are asked to sign the list on the back table in church, so that the Rosary can travel from one family to another in union of prayer.
