# FEAST OF ST. JEROME, PRIEST, SCHOLAR, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

## A BLESSED FEASTDAY, FATHER JEROME!

St. Jerome, the renowned Scripture scholar, was born in 342 A.D. at Stridon, Dalmatia. As a young student in Rome, he was baptized a Christian. Mortifying himself by abstinence and meditation, Jerome spent days and nights in study and in a desert hermitage. Although his native language was Illyrian, he mastered Hebrew, Greek, and Latin and wrote numerous spiritual books. In Bethlehem, he spent thirty years on his major literary work, THE VULGATE. This Latin version of Sacred Scripture became the Church's official translation of the Bible. Jerome died in Bethlehem in 420 A.D. His body rests in the Basilica of St Mary Major in Rome.

Almighty, ever-living God, you endowed Saint Jerome with a deep reverence for Holy Scripture, which he loved with all his heart. Sustain us ever more with your Word and help us to find in it the source of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### FEAST OF ST. THERESE OF THE CHILD JESUS -

OCTOBER 1st Like our beloved Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, lived only 24 years on earth, but became a very great saint, by living the "Little Way" of trusting in God. She loved flowers and saw herself as the "little flower of Jesus," who gave glory to God by just being her beautiful little self among all the other flowers in God's garden. Because of this analogy, the title "The Little Flower" remained with St. Therese. Although she was a cloistered Carmelite sister, she became a patron of all missionaries by the support of sacrifice, and prayer.

#### FEAST OF THE GUARDIAN ANGELS - OCTOBER 2nd

Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here. Ever this day, be at my side, to light, to guard, to rule, to guide. #### FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI - OCTOBER 4th

St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of Italy, is a beloved saint, not just because he loved animals and all of God's creatures. He could have become a great scholar, businessman, or political ruler, but chose to follow Jesus in a life of evangelical poverty and loving service of the people most poor – those who did not know God.

One day while praying in an old, dilapidated church, Francis heard Jesus say, "Go, rebuild my Church for it has fallen into ruins." Thinking that Jesus meant repairing the old church in the village, he immediately rose to find lumber and nails. Then Jesus made it clear that he was to renew Faith in His Church. He must follow Him in a life of holiness, sacrifice, prayer, poverty, and charity, telling everyone of the infinite Love God has for His creation. Others joined him in the Franciscan Order of Missionaries, itinerant preachers, traveling over the world to preach the Gospel. Francis was devoted to the Infant Jesus and was the first to build the Christmas manger scene. He especially loved Holy Mass and the Eucharist, and spent hours in adoration before the crucifix. While meditating on the sacred Passion of the Lord, his body was pierced with the Stigmata, the wounds of Jesus Crucified.
