**THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME –

**REMEMBRANCE DAY, VETERANS DAY  
NOVEMBER 11**

Across Canada and the United States, people will gather on  
November 11 to honor veterans, living and deceased. The  
hostilities of the First World War ceased on November 11, 1918  
at 11 A.M.—the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the  
eleventh month. The following year marked the first observance  
of a day to remember and honor those who died, as well as to  
give thanks for the sacrifices of those who came back from  
serving their country. First Nations have demonstrated time and  
again their great service for their country in the First and Second  
World Wars, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Wars in Iraq  
and Afghanistan. It is estimated that over 7,000 served in  
military forces and 500 died in wars. We thank all our veterans  
of St. Regis for their service and pray for the living and  
deceased.

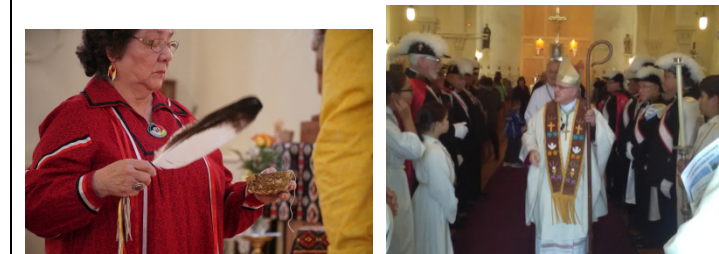
