SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING – NOVEMBER 25TH

LAST SUNDAY OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR

"Christ Jesus, Victor! Christ Jesus, Ruler! Christ Jesus, Lord and Redeemer!"

Jesus's kingdom is totally at odds with any display of power in this world. Jesus kept company with tax-collectors, sinners and prostitutes, so much so that the authorities described Jesus as "a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners." (Luke 7:34) Modern kings receive important dignitaries; Jesus received the lowly and rejected people of His time. A king might expect to receive gifts from his subjects.

Jesus gave gifts. He restored health to those who were sick. He forgave sinners. He gave us the greatest gift, His own Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist. Earthly kings wear crowns of gold and jewels and proudly display their power and authority. Jesus wore a crown of thorns and appeared powerless. His throne was a wooden cross with "King of the Jews" inscribed on it. Jesus came to establish a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace.

In every **OUR FATHER**, we pray, "Thy Kingdom Come!" Lord, help us to realize that to make that prayer effective, we may have to abandon what the world considers important and even be prepared to bear the ignominy of the Cross. Jesus Christ, King and Center of Hearts, make our hearts like unto Thine!
