WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

*Mary can teach us kindness... "They have no wine", she told
Jesus at Cana. Let us, like Mary, be aware of the needs of the
poor, be they be spiritual or material, and let us, like her, give
generously of the love and grace we are granted. (St. Mother
Teresa)*

How appropriate it is to begin our reflection today at the Wedding
Feast of Cana, a manifestation of the Divine Power of Jesus
changing water into wine so that a poor couple would not suffer
embarrassment at their wedding feast. The Mother of Jesus notices
the need and simply tells her Son, "They have no wine". She trusts
Him to help. He does!

Today is **WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES**. Daily on
social media, we see pictures of our brothers and sisters in Christ
suffering oppression, exile, homelessness, neglect. The theme for
this **WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY** is "Justice. Only
Justice you shall pursue, " Let us join Christians throughout the world
in prayer for those suffering injustices, for the poor, the refugees
lacking food, clothing, and shelter. We pray that those in authority
will hear the **CRY OF THE POOR** and give generous and merciful
attention to assist them.

God's Word proclaimed by Isaiah the Prophet promises, "You shall
no longer be called Forsaken." St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians,
reminds us that "each one of us has been given the manifestation of
the Spirit for the common good."

Reflect and pray. What gifts has God given to me so that I can bring
justice to the poor? In her words to the servants at the wedding
feast of Cana, Mother Mary tells them to listen to Jesus, "Whatever
He shall say, do it." Pray. Listen. Act.

FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES- JANUARY 24

Francis de Sales (1567 – 1622) was destined by his father to
become a lawyer .Francis obeyed and earned a Doctorate in
Law at the University of Padua. However, he felt God's call to
enter the priesthood and received his father's consent to be
ordained. At the age of 35, Francis was appointed Bishop of
Geneva, Switzerland, a center of the Calvinists. He showed
love for his enemies and practiced his own axiom, "A spoonful of
honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar."
Francis once said, "The measure of love is to love without
measure." He took seriously the words of Jesus, "Learn from
Me, for I am gentle and humble of heart." Francis said that it
took him 20 years to conquer his quick temper. No one would
have suspected that he had that problem, since he looked to the
Heart of Jesus to convert him. If we wish to effect true change in
our world, we must first change our own hearts. Our hearts
must beat with the Love of the Heart of Christ and nothing else.
St. Francis de Sales wrote "The Introduction to the Devout Life,
a spiritual classic to help ordinary souls attain sanctity.

**FEAST OF THE CONVERSION OF
ST. PAUL – JANUARY 25**

The zealous Pharisee, Saul of Tarsus, was enroute to
Damascus to drive out the Christians when he experienced
JESUS. Knocked off his horse by a bolt of light, Saul
heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute
Me?" One sentence determined his conversion: "I am
Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5b). Jesus
identified Himself with people – the loving group of people
Saul had been running down like criminals. Once
converted, Saul was changed to St. Paul whose whole life
became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message
of the cross. In baptism, Christians die to sin and are buried
with Christ. They are made into a new creation by Christ
The conversion of St. Paul, in spite of his attempts to
completely eradicate Christianity is seen as evidence of the
power of Divine Grace. "With Christ I am nailed to the
cross. I live now, not I, but Christ lives in me"
