## FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME FEBRUARY 10, 2019

We hear ourselves in Peter's resigned word to Jesus: "We have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." I have been doing what you are suggesting and it has not worked. Fine, I'll do it again.

So much of the spiritual life is about devoted repetition of the same actions, which sometimes seem to have no effect. We pray the same words day after day and year after year, and we do not see any change. We speak kindly and seem to be ignored. We mess up and say sorry and try to change, and then we mess up again.

On a fishing boat with seasoned fisherman Jesus' advice is almost laughable. As if they had not thought to put down the nets. What God whispers into our souls is often not the shocking instruction to build an ark, but the ordinary invitation to try love again. Walk beside your people and laugh with them. Respond to those who ask you to help – again. Make something for dinner and share a meal.

And then, when all that habitual love produces something unexpectedly beautiful, do we respond like Peter? Forgive me for my doubt that loving again will actually change the world. Let me chose faith and love – *again*.

## FEAST OF SAINT JEROME EMILIANI FEBRUARY 8, 2019

Jerome was the founder of the Somascan Fathers and Brothers, also known as the Company of the Servants of the Poor. Jerome was born in Venice in 1486. Initially he pursued a career in the military and gave very little thought to God. After a conversion experience, however, he gave all his possessions to the poor, became a priest and devoted himself to the instruction of orphans and troubled youth, and the care of the poor. He founded an order, the Somascan Fathers, to help with this work. One of his acquaintances was Pietro Carafa, who later became Pope Paul IV. Jerome died on this day in 1537 of an illness contracted while tending the sick. He is a patron of orphans and abandoned children.

# FEBRUARY 10, 2019

Scholastica was the twin sister of Saint Benedict, the founder of Western monasticism and she was the leader of a women's community likely located near Benedict's monastery at Monte Cassino. What little is known about her life is found in Saint Gregory the Great's book, the second Dialogue, which is an account of her brother's miracles. She died about 543 and was buried in Benedict's tomb, where he joined her in death soon after. She is the patron of nuns – especially Benedictines – and children with convulsive disorders.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP**

### **NEW BISHOP REV. GUY DESROCHERS**

The Episcopal Ordination of the new bishop of Alexandria-Cornwall Diocese MOST REV. GUY DESROCHERS, C.Ss.R. will take place on February 22, 2019 at St. Finnan's Cathedral in Alexandria, Ontario. The Rev. Fr Guy Desrochers was born in Hull, Québec in 1956. He was ordained as a priest in January 1989. The Diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall has 27 parishes and missions, with a Catholic population of 60,000.

## FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES FEBRUARY 11, 2019

The veneration of Mary as Our Lady of Lourdes arose first in popular devotion and later in the Church's liturgy. In 1858 Mary, the Mother of Jesus, appeared to Bernadette Soubirious in a cave at Massabielle, near Lourdes in France. Just four years earlier, in 1854 the Church had declared the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, so when the "beautiful woman" of Bernadette's visions identified herself aa the Immaculate Conception, there was initial skepticism, Although others accompanied Bernadette to the grotto, no one else could see or hear the visions. It did not take very long for an Episcopal Commission, an official inquiry, to state: "We judge that Mary, the Immaculate Mother of God, did really appear to Bernadette Soubirious on February 11, 1858, and on certain subsequent days, 18 times in all, in the Grotto of Massabielle, near the town of Lourdes: that this appearance bears every mark of truth and that the belief of the faithful is well-grounded." A few years later, this date was added to the list of Marian feasts to honour the mysterious beautify of the Immaculate Conception.

### THE STORY OF ST. VALENTINE

Valentine was a pious young priest imprisoned by the Romans for preaching Christ's love. He cared very deeply for his parishioners and wanted to send them a message expressing his love and concern. Trusting completely in God's providence, Valentine wrote a message and placed it in the beak of a dove which had miraculously landed on his window. His worried parishioners were delighted to receive word that Valentine held them dear in his thoughts and prayers. So began the custom of sending special greetings to those we love on Valentine's Day.
