SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
FEBRUARY 17, 2019

The world and all its pleasures are temporary. As tempting as these worldly realities are, we are called to conform ourselves to Christ's vision of the good life. In today's Gospel Jesus gives us a glimpse of heaven, and it is a vision which brings both consolation and warning. In Luke's account of the Beatitudes, we witness how Jesus heals all those gathered in body and soul while he teaches the multitudes what it means to live in friendship with God.

Jesus tells of the blessings we can expect, but he doesn't stop there. For those who remain attached to wealth, physical comforts and the good opinion of others. Jesus reminds us these things will not satisfy the deepest desires of the human heart. Our continued attachment to those things will only cause us misery in this life and the next.

In that light, it is worth considering the words of the prophet Jeremiah from today's first reading. Where do we put our faith? In our trust in the Lord, or elsewhere? Who (or what) commands our loyalty? Let us give thanks to God for the wisdom and transformative power of Christ. Through God's grace may we persevere in following Jesus' example, focused on a vision of what truly counts.
