EASTER SUNDAY, APRIL 21, 2019 THE LORD IS TRULY RISEN, ALLELUIA. TO HIM BE GLORY AND POWER FOR ALL THE AGES OF ETERNITY, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!

Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday, commemorates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Easter is the culmination of the Passion of Jesus, and is one of the chief tenets of the Christian faith. It established Jesus as the powerful Son of God, and is cited as proof that God will righteously judge the world. For those who trust in Jesus' death and resurrection, "death is swallowed up in victory." Any person who chooses to follow Jesus receives "a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead". Through faith in the working of God, those who follow Jesus are spiritually resurrected with Him, so that they may walk in a new way of life and receive eternal salvation.

The feast of Christmas shines only in the light of the Resurrection. Easter is the primary act that fulfills the purpose of Christ's ministry on earth—to defeat death by dying and to purify and exalt His body, risen from the dead.

At the Easter Vigil, all light in the church building is extinguished. Then, a new flame is struck and the priest prays:

- Christ yesterday and today, the Beginning and the End, the Alpha and the Omega. All time belongs to Him and all ages. To Him be glory and power through every age and forever. Amen.
- By His holy and glorious wounds, may Christ the Lord guard us and protect us. Amen.
- May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

He then lights candles held by his assistants, who then go to light candles held by the congregation. The priest and congregation go in a procession to the altar, proclaiming the Light of Christ.

• By Thy Resurrection O Christ our savior, the angels in Heaven sing, enable us who are on Earth, to glorify thee in purity of heart.

The singing of the "Exultet" is the official proclamation that Jesus Christ, once dead, has arisen to life! All purple cloths are removed from the statues. Church bells are rung again.

Traditionally, Easter eggs with a promise of eternal life, are cracked together to celebrate the opening of the tomb of Christ. They are red in memory of Jesus blood shed for us. During Easter week there is no fasting. The customary Paschal greeting is "Christ is risen!", to which the response is: "Truly He is risen!"

SPRING

Spring is a permanent word of hope. It always comes. No matter how long or fierce the winter, spring forces its way through the tons of ice and snow. No matter how horrible the death, how unbearable the pain, and absolute the rejection, despite the tons of stone and dirt against the tomb, Easter happens and life grows green as all the forces of death are exhausted. *May Christ Easter in us this April.*

NEXT SATURDAY, Bishop Terry R. LaValley, Bishop of Ogdensburg, will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on nine of our parishioners. One of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church, like Baptism and Holy Orders, a person who receives Confirmation receives, in addition to grace, a sacramental character or "seal" by which the person receives a sacramental configuration to Christ and His Church, brought about by the Spirit. It remains forever as a positive disposition for grace, a promise and guarantee of divine protection. These three sacraments can never be repeated. The following prayer is offered by the Bishop, as he extends his hands over the confirmands:

All powerful God, Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit, You freed Your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send Your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
