SOLEMNITY OF THE TRINITY – JUNE 16, 2019

FEAST OF ST. JOHN FRANCIS REGIS, S.J. Alleluia! Glory to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; to God Who is, Who was, and is to come. Alleluia!

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast of the Holy Trinity is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth, but I submit humbly and say: Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the mysteries "that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God." The ultimate end of the whole divine economy is the entry of God's creature into the perfect unity of the Holy Trinity. Even now we are called to be a dwelling for the Blessed Trinity in Whom we are baptized. Jesus assured us, "If a man loves me, he will keep my word and my Father will love him, and we will come to him, and make our home with him." (John 14:23)

O my God, Trinity Whom I adore, help me forget myself entirely and to establish myself in You, unmovable and peaceful as though my soul were already in eternity. OUR PATRONAL FEAST OF ST. JOHN FRANCIS REGIS, S.J.

June 16 is also the feast of our holy patron, St. John Francis Regis, S.J., patron saint of marriage. In 1597, John Francis Regis was born of noble parents and was educated by the Society of Jesus. He became a skilled catechist and entered the seminary in 1616. He offered his first Mass in 1631. Shortly after, he spent his life caring for victims of the plague outbreak in the city of Toulouse, France. His first assignment was to become a missionary to the Huguenots, the lapsed Catholics, and others in need of evangelization. In over 50 districts of France, he preached the Gospel to children, the poor, prisoners, and derelicts of society. His best known work involved helping women to escape prostitution. Hearing of the zeal and labor of the Jesuit missionaries among the Native People of America, John asked to become a missionary to Canada. However, his religious superiors felt he was too valuable in helping the Poor of France. He spent difficult winter days journeying among the Poor, and then would be in the confessional throughout the night to help sinners return to God. While preaching a mission in December 1640, at the age of 43. a penitent found the priest unconscious in the confessional. He died after receiving the Last Rites.

Hailed as a confessor of the faith and a model for Jesuit missionaries, St. John Francis Regis was canonized in 1737. When the first Mohawk families of Kahnawake with their priest, Father Antoine Gordon, S.J. decided to move to Akwesasne in 1752, they agreed to name the new church in honor of St. John Francis Regis who had longed to come to America to evangelize its Natives. Today, St. Regis Mission reaches out throughout this territory, giving his name to the village, the road, St. Regis River, St. Regis Mohawk Tribe, St. Regis Falls, and many other places.

Therefore, we will hold the special festivities for St. John the Baptist on Sunday, after the 10 A.M. MASS ON SUNDAY, JUNE 30th, Father Jerome will bless the pine tree in honor of St. John the Baptist. Then he will bless the St. Lawrence River so that our children may swim safely and all boaters may have safe passage.
