FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Today's first reading reminds us of the Noahic covenant of love God made with all creation – a covenant which, in the second reading, Peter tells us prefigures our baptism and is sealed for all eternity by the resurrection of Jesus Christ. On our wedding day we vowed to be true to each other, to love and honour each other all the days of our lives. This amazing promise gives us a small glimpse into the covenant God has made with his people. Our marriage covenant blesses us with extraordinary joy and the challenge of self-emptying love. Likewise, God's love is both a gift and an invitation. Immediately after receiving his Father's blessing and promise of steadfast love at his baptism, Jesus was sent in the wilderness. As we enter the Lenten season, we too are called to deepen our covenant with God by entering our own wilderness. Through fasting, prayer and giving this Lenten season, we deepen our relationship with God and neighbour, which in turn prepares our hearts for the extraordinary joy of Easter. God patiently waits for us to ask, "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths." His covenant with us is a promise to be with us always, even in the desert. Like Jesus, may we emerge from the desert ready to proclaim the good news.

DESERT EXPERIENCE – God says, "Be still and know that I am God." We cannot be physically in a desert, but we need to create a desert place in our hearts –a quiet place to reflect on who we are, why God has created us, where we are headed? To see God. escape stress, worry, bombardment of noise and social media. God is everywhere -- within us, within nature, within all the people we encounter. Lift your mind and heart to Him.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION During Lent, Father Jerome will be available at the St. Regis Mission Church to hear confessions on Saturday afternoons from 3:00 PM to 3:45 PM and on Sunday mornings from 9:00 AM - 9:45 AM. **LENT** is the season of penance and prayer before Easter. Lent starts every year on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday 2021 falls on February 17, 2021 and Holy Saturday falls on April 3, 2021. LENT is the 6 week period between Ash Wednesday during which Catholics and members of other Christian denominations commit to fasting. Fasting is believed to bring a person closer to God through denying the physical body of certain food and drink. Christians have fasted for thousands of years and in modern times, fasting includes more than just abstaining from food and drink. During Lent, people have been known to abstain from talking, television, the Internet and other forms of modern conveniences.
