PENTECOST SUNDAY

Seven weeks after that memorable resurrection Sabbath, the disciples were still very fear filled. Huddled together, hidden behind locked doors, they waited - fearful and faithful. Jesus had asked them to wait until he sent the spirit. Imagine the scene as these newly confident disciples poured out a message that each listener heard in their own language. BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH May

24, 2021: Mary, the Mother of the Church was instituted by Pope Francis on February 11, 2018 – the 160th anniversary of the apparition of Mary at Lourdes. The title "Mother of the Church" was bestowed on the Blessed Virgin Mary during the Second Vatican Council by People Paul VI who

declared that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by the tenderest of titles." This movable feast is observed on the Monday following Pentecost and takes precedence over other memorials which may fall on the same day.
