
MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

St. Mathew tells us that en route to a special meeting with Jesus 40 days after his resurrection, some of the disciples doubted. Yes, God's family members no doubt: sitting in Mass we too might guestion Jesus' omnipotence. How then did so many disciples come to be martyred for proclaiming the Christian Gospel? What shifted Jesus' followers from doubt to death defying evangelization? Jesus answered their doubts and questions by acknowledging the Holy Trinity. The disciples needed to know who Jesus was, what they were to do, and where he would be when they needed him. Jesus, as God the Son, told them of his authority in heaven and on earth. Then, speaking for God the Father, he counselled them to go to all people and make them disciples as well, baptizing them into, and teaching them the ways of, God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. "I am with you always: was Jesus' reassurance of his constant presence, prefiguring the coming of God the Holy Spirt at Pentecost. Jesus came near to his eleven on a mountain to reveal the might - in the same way Jesus comes near to us in Holy Eucharist, to reassure and empower us by the Three in One and One in Three. Today are we prepared for Christ Jesus' *missa* meeting, his sending us out into the world, for Mass?

DEAR SAINT KATERI. You know that our life passes guickly and is without meaning if it is without God. Help us, through your prayer, that we might open our hearts to God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and thus know the joy of living in the peace of Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Help us through your prayer so that we might persevere in our own prayer and in the desire for God.
