14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It can be difficult to see God working in our lives. He often speaks to us through those around us, through seemingly ordinary events and people in ways that are surprising and unexpected. In today's Gospel, Jesus returned to his hometown, Nazareth, where he faced misunderstanding, opposition and rejection. The townspeople knew his family and had seen him grow up. To them he was simply the carpenter, the son of Mary, their neighbour. They were astonished by his wisdom, and refused to believe that one of their own could be the promised Messiah and speak God's word. Our own expectations can often prevent us from hearing God's word, too. The Lord's work in the Church and in our lives is a sign of his immense love, but it can present itself in ways that are challenging and unforeseen. He chose a fisherman to head his church and a tiny nun, St. Teresa of Calcutta, to be a model of charity. God invites us to move beyond outward appearances and to receive the richness of his grace and presence, however it meets us. The Lord's grace often works in surprising and mysterious ways. Let us open our hearts and minds today to recognize God's presence in the everyday people and situations in our lives, and to receive his grace and merciful love with faith and humility.



ST. THOMAS, APOSTLE FEAST DAY JULY

<u>03, 2021</u> On July 3, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Thomas the Apostle. Best known for his initial unwillingness to believe the other apostles in their claim that Jesus had risen from the dead, St. Thomas can teach the faithful about believing without seeing. As an apostle, Thomas was dedicated to following the Lord. Upon hearing that Jesus was returning to Judea, an area that would pose dangers due to the growing animosity of the authorities there, he immediately said to the other apostles, "Let us also go, that

we may die with him" (Jn 11: 16). In his general audience on September 27, 2006, Pope Benedict XVI spoke of St. Thomas, explaining that we can learn from his doubts, which show us "that Jesus can now be recognized by his wounds rather than by his face." "The Apostle Thomas' case is important to us for at least three reasons," said the Pope. "First, because it comforts us in our insecurity; second, because it shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty; and, lastly, because the words that Jesus addressed to him remind us of the true meaning of mature faith and encourage us to persevere, despite the difficulty, along our journey of adhesion to him." St. Thomas is the patron of architects and builders.

Did You Know...victims of trafficking do not seek help or leave for the following reasons: (1) Isolation – victims are often confined and isolated from friends and family; (2) Fear – Victims are often physically abused and they and their loved ones are often threatened; (3) Victims often blame themselves, feel hopeless, and do not see a way out of the situation; (4) Dependency – victims may become dependent on drugs and/or develop a trauma bond with their traffickers, both of which makes it difficult to escape.
