29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

John and James' request to sit beside Jesus' right and left hand in glory is bold – some might say smug – but not unexpected. Throughout Mark's Gospel, the disciples have displayed an inability to understand the true nature of the kingdom of God, as well as the suffering and death that are the culmination of his ministry. His reply challenges expectations of leadership and political authority common in the first century AD.

Jesus overturns the stand and conception of power as something that comes at the expense of the ruled. He also explodes the disciples' related assumption that their proximity to him bears certain special privileges that set them above others. The climax of today's Gospel is forceful: Jesus came to serve and not be served. True leadership is servant leadership and those who are greatest in the kingdom must become like slaves, willing to suffer and even die, for the common good. The glory of the kingdom comes not through violent means, but rather in and through the Cross.

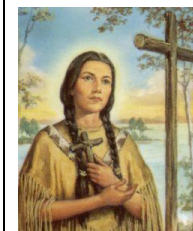
Like the disciples, we are not immune to distorted conceptions of power and leadership. Living in the kingdom demands that we challenge our tendencies to side with those in power against the weak. The world will know us as true disciples of Jesus when we commit ourselves in loving service to the common good.



FEAST OF ST. TERESA OF AVILA – OCTOBER 15:

St. Teresa (1515-1582) was born in Avila and died in Alba, Spain. At the age of eighteen she joined the Carmelite Order and chose Christ as her heavenly Spouse. With the help of St. John of the Cross she reformed most of the Carmelite convents and founded new ones. She reached the highest degree of prayer and

through prayer obtained such knowledge of divine things that in 1970 Pope Paul VI named her the first woman Doctor of the Church. She is the Patron of: sickness; against headaches; against heart disease; loss of parents; those in need of grace; and the religious.



9TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CANONIZATION OF ST KATERI TEKAKWITHA:

Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks", Kateri Tekakwitha was born in 1656 in Ossemenon (today Auriesville, New York) She died of tuberculosis on April 17, 1680, shortly before her 24th birthday, and was buried at St. Francis Xavier Mission. Her final words were: "Jesus Konoronkwa" ("Jesus, I love you). Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012, in Rome. She is popularly venerated as a patroness of ecology. St. Kateri Tekakwitha pray for us.
