SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"I say to you who listen..." Jesus is very clear in today's Gospel passage: if you want to follow him, then a particular stance toward other people will be required. This is not the first such lesson he has shared with his disciples, but it is the most demanding and the most revolutionary. It calls into question basic instincts of self-preservation, of fighting back when we are attacked, of emerging the winner.

Love your enemy, practice non-violence, forgive and be peacemakers. Surely these demands shocked and challenged Jesus' disciples as they might shock us today who live in a culture that often seeks revenge and retribution first. But Jesus expects that we will treat the other, especially the enemy and stranger whom we might fear or distrust, as we want to be treated. Living up to this expectation will challenge us throughout our lives.

In less than two weeks, we will begin our Lenten journey, a time of reflection and taking stock on our way to Easter. This passage might be our guide as we reflect on how we are meeting Jesus' expectations. Are we striving to embed this stand in our lives? Have we slipped back into old ways? Our life as kingdom-dwellers may depend on how seriously we take this comment. (Source: Living With Christ)



LENT BEGINS ON ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH 2, 2022. The

word Lent is derived from the Anglo-Saxon words lencten, meaning "Spring," and lenctentid, which literally means "Springtide". Lent is a special period of 40 days of prayer, penance,

sacrifice and good works in preparation for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery – the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. This holy season is meant to renew our faith, to increase our generosity in spiritual and corporal works of mercy. It is a time when we try to perform extra spiritual works, like attending daily Mass, making the Stations of the Cross, offering a weekly holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament, or taking time for personal prayer and spiritual reading. We repent of sin, make a good confession and receive sacramental absolution. A good Lent prepares us to celebrate joyfully the mysteries of our salvation at Easter.



ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY: The

gesture of receiving ashes on the forehead in the form of a cross is acknowledgment of our unworthiness to be in the presence of the All Holy God. In the tradition of Israel, this humble posture reminds us that we are nobody (like ashes) and we need conversion to become somebody (in Christ).

Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.

CHURCH OF THE NORTH COUNTRY CELEBRATES 150

YEARS On February 16th, 2022, the Diocese of Ogdensburg celebrates the 150th Anniversary of the establishment of the Diocese. On February 16, 1872 by Pope Pius IX, acknowledged the newly formed diocese. Until 1872 the entire North

Country which is now under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Ogdensburg was a part of the Albany Diocese. In 1871 the Bishop of Albany discussed with his counsellors the advisability of recommending to the Holy See a division of the Albany Diocese. The recommendation was made. Ogdensburg was designated by the authorities at Rome as the seat of the new see, and Father Edgar P. Wadhams, rector of the Cathedral of Albany and Vicar General of the Albany Diocese, was named the first bishop.
