SIXTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Images of hospitality and ease in relationship with God are interwoven through today's readings. Receptive, generous and gracious in service to the Lord, Abraham models hospitality as a spiritual practice. In return, he receives an unexpected blessing. To the psalmist, those who "abide" in God are in word and act virtuous, loving, honest, affirming, just and respectful. Like Abraham, they model God whom they serve.

The story of Mary: Martha and Jesus in Luke's Gospel is familiar to us – Mary: the receptive listener at Jesus' feet and her sister, Martha, the practical hostess busy in the background. In fact, the sisters have distinguished by tradition as models of different types of spiritual expression: Mary, contemplation and Martha, action.

We can identify with the encounter and see ourselves in them. Yet, in light of the other readings, we realize the central focus of their gathering is not simply entertainment but discipleship itself.

Disciples are called, says Paul, to make the word of God fully known, the word which is Christ in them. The one thing needed by Mary, Martha and all disciples is immersion in Jesus' person; an "at homeness" in relationship with him that enables us to reflect his presence, his hospitality, his reverence for all. So transformed we can be his eyes, his hands, his heart every day. (LivingwithChrist)



"IN OLD AGE THEY WILL STILL BEAR FRUIT" This is the theme chosen by the Holy Father for the II World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 2022. **ON SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2022, THE SECOND WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY** will be celebrated throughout the

universal Church. The theme chosen by the Holy Father for the occasion is "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15) and intends to emphasize how grandparents and the elderly are a value and a gift both for society and for ecclesial communities.

The theme is also an invitation to reconsider and value grandparents and the elderly who are too often kept on the margins of families, civil and ecclesial communities. Their experience of life and faith can contribute, in fact, to building societies that are aware of their roots and capable of dreaming of a future based on greater solidarity. The invitation to listen to the wisdom of the years is also particularly significant in the context of the synodal journey that the Church has undertaken.

The Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life invites parishes, dioceses, associations and ecclesial communities throughout the world to find ways to celebrate the Day in their own pastoral context. Happy Grandparents day to all of our Akwesasronon Totas! God Bless!

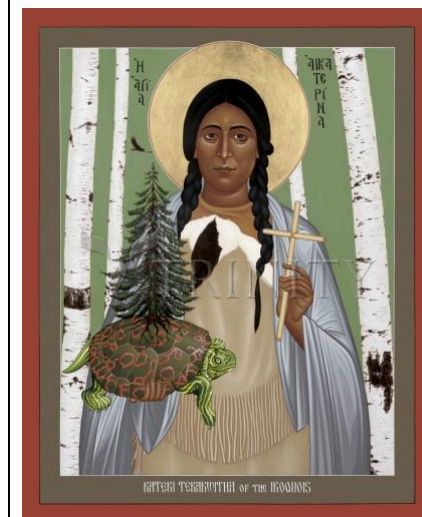
women in labour. As the grandparents of Jesus, Saints Anne and Joachim are also considered the patron saints of grandparents.

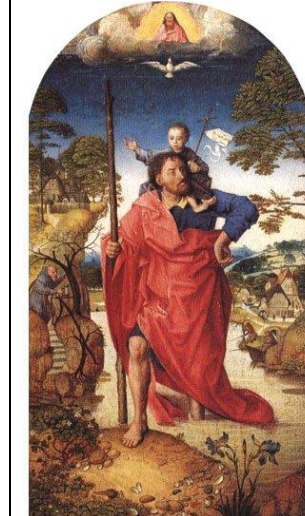
U.S. FEAST DAY OF ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA JULY 14, 2022 Although Canada's liturgical calendar designates the feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha on the date of her death, April 17th, the United States liturgical calendar celebrates her feast on July 14th. We celebrate St. Kateri, Lily of the Mohawks, on both dates. St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She is

the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.
