SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND ELDERLY

While Abraham pleads with God to spare the innocent in the first reading, Jesus teaches his disciples in the Gospel to pray by asking. This is uncomfortable for me. Isn't it rude to ask? Wouldn't it be presumptuous? And what if I ask and God savs no?

But it isn't just asking God that can be hard for me. Sometimes I expect my partner to know what I need without my asking. Not wanting to burden others or be disappointed, I avoid asking for help. Noticing this resistance, a counsellor encouraged me to face my frustration with the question, "What do I need right now?' Often it takes me a bit of time and work to even name what I need. Once I know, then it is easier to ask.

When I ask God for what I think I need, a conversation opens between us. Sometimes my need is clarified, sometimes it is met, and sometimes I feel better just by naming the need and knowing that I am waiting to see how it will be answered.

In asking God and others more often: I was surprised that the most reassuring part of asking is not what is given, but that God embraces me in my need. This is not selfish or presumptuous: asking and receiving are gifts we give to those who love us. (Source: Living with Christ)

for Papal Visit The Pope's journey to Canada is scheduled to take place from July 24 -30, 2022. He will visit the cities of Edmonton, Québec and Iqaluit. "Dear brothers and sisters of Canada, as you know, I will come among you especially in the name of Jesus to meet and embrace the indigenous peoples". "Now I am about to

make a penitential pilgrimage, which I hope, with God's grace, will contribute to the journey of healing and reconciliation already undertaken." The Pope is scheduled to deliver nine homilies and addresses and say two masses during his stay in Canada.. On July 28th, Pope Francis will be at Ste. Anne de Beaupré to celebrate Mass at the Ste. Anne de Beaupré Basilica with First Nations, Inuit, Métis and others.

The Archdiocese of Ottawa is sponsoring two buses to attend the papal mass. One bus will be leaving from Ottawa and the other from Cornwall. Forty-three Akwesasronon will be participating in the pilgrimage. The bus from Cornwall will be departing at 8:00 AM from the St. Columban Church parking lot for Quebec City. There will be a lunch stop at noon with the bus from Ottawa and Cornwall meeting together for a bag lunch (provided). Arrival in Quebec City will be 2:00pm. There will be ceremonies on the Plains of Abraham site in Quebec City from 3:30pm to 5pm. Supper will be on our own. The cost of the bus, driver, lunch and dinner, as well as overnight accommodation will be covered by the Archdiocese of Ottawa. We thank the Archdiocese for their generosity and support to the St. Regis

Mission at this important time in church history. Buses will leave the hotel at 6:00 AM July 28th for the Papal Mass at St. Anne de Beaupre. Indian Residential School survivors will have priority for seating in the Basilica, all others will be outside the Basilica. Departure for Cornwall will be 4:30pm and arrival back at St. Columban Church at 10:00 pm. For more information please contact RJ Dolly McDonald.
