HOLY TRINITY SOLEMNITY SUNDAY



Holy Trinity Sunday is celebrated on the first Sunday following Pentecost. It is a solemn celebration of the belief in the revelation of one God, yet three divine persons. In the early 4th century when the Arian heresy was spreading, the early church, recognizing the inherent Christological and Trinitarian implications, prepared an Office of Prayer with canticles. responses, a preface, and hymns, to be recited on Sundays to proclaim the Holy Trinity. Pope John XXII (14th century) instituted the celebration as a feast for the entire Church; the celebration became a solemnity after the liturgical reforms of Vatican II. Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than an event or person.



THE FEAST OF **CORPUS CHRISTI:** The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name. Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday

following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity.

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal.

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). After her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION JUNE 19 - There will be a Corpus Christi Procession starting at 10:00 AM from the St. Regis Mission Church processing to four altars in a loop to the MCA Justice Building and back to the Church. Make sure to attend Mass and participate in the procession on this special feast time occasion.

FATHER'S DAY JUNE 19. Father Jerome will be blessing the Fathers, Grandfathers, Great Grandfathers, Stepfathers and all the men in the parish for Fathers Day. Happy Father's Day!



FEAST DAY OF ST. JOHN **FRANCIS REGIS --JUNE 16th**

Father John Francis Regis, S.J. was canonized a saint in 1737. The early Jesuit missionaries who ministered to the Mohawks of Kahnawake were devoted to this saint who wore himself out in laboring for the poor, the sick, the prostitutes, the prisoners in France at the time of Huguenot wars against Catholics. St. Regis spent nights in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament for

the people to whom he ministered during the day. He spent long hours in the confessional to be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Although this zealous priest asked to be sent to Canada to minister to the Native Peoples, his religious superiors believed that the poor in France needed him also. While preaching a mission, Father Regis heard confessions far into the night. A penitent found him lying unconscious on the floor. After receiving the Last Rites, Father Regis died at the age of 43, never to visit Canada.

About 1752, Father Antoine Gordon, S.J. accompanied some Mohawk Catholic families who were moving from Kahnawake to Akwesasne. In memory of the recently canonized St. John Francis Regis, S.J. they dedicated the first church in his honor. Although St. Regis had not been able to realize his dream of being a missionary to the Native Peoples, he became an inspiration for many. His name adorns the St. Regis Mission Church in the St. Regis Village (Kana:takon) on the St. Regis Mohawk Reservation.
