CORPUS CHRISTI CELEBRATION The Feast of Corpus Christi is being celebrated on SUNDAY, JUNE 19th. At the beginning of the 10:00 AM Mass Father Jerome will lead the procession with the Blessed Sacrament and stop for prayers at four altars along the way. Everyone is invited to join the procession.

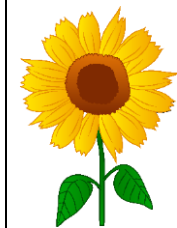
NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST (JUNE 24)

The birth of John the Baptist was one of the earliest feasts to be named to a particular day on the Church Calendar. June 24 was chosen as it is six months before the birth of Christ. With its proximity to the summer solstice, it signifies the waning of the light, while the birth of Jesus near the winter solstice marks the coming of the light. When John was born, his parents, Elizabeth and Zachariah, called him John in accordance with an angel's instruction. In disbelief that they would have a son, Zachariah asked for a sign and was made mute, but his speech was restored. Luke records that he responded with the Benedictus, the great hymn of love and thanksgiving still recited in the liturgy of the hours.

CELEBRATION OF THE BODY OF CHRIST: For 150 years, the Lord has blessed the people of the **Diocese of Ogdensburg** with charisms to lead and minister to His flock. The Celebration of the Body of Christ is our opportunity to recognize the many graces the Lord has bestowed on his people. CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR 2022 CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES

who were confirmed by His Excellency Most Reverend Bishop Noel Simard of the Diocese of Valleyfield on Sunday June 12, 2022. They were Ryder Sunday, Christopher James Cook and Tobilee Marie Roundpoint. The Confirmation Ceremony was part of a Pastoral Visit from Bishop Simard which also included a gathering with St. Regis Mission lay leaders, ministers and members of the Mission Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils. The gathering was culminated by a luncheon hosted at the Tsi Snaihne Recreation Center.



Bishop Simard shared with the representatives gathered an up date on the Pope Francis "Synod on Synodality." The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process that Pope Francis began last October. Officially known as "Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church," it is a process that allows bishops to consult with Catholics — from parishioners all the way up to priests — in a spirit of collaboration and openness.

Most Reverend Bishop Noel Simard closed the gathering by reporting on the greatly anticipated visit of Pope Francis to Canada in July. The Vatican formally announced the visit by Pope Francis to Canada which will be from July 24 to 29, 2022. The Pope will make three stops to sites of former Indian residential schools, in Edmonton, Quebec City and Iqaluit. The dates of the three main stops by the Pope have not yet been confirmed. It is anticipated that the Pope might visit Quebec City on July 28, 2022. The St. Regis Mission is hoping to charter a group of parishioners to attend the Papal visit when the date is confirmed.
