JUNE 24 THE NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

The feast of John the Baptist is a Christian feast day that commemorates the birth of John the Baptist, who told the coming of the Messiah.

John the Baptist knew he had been born to be 'set apart for God' so he completely devoted his life to encouraging people to repent their sins and prepare for the coming of the Messiah.

People flocked to be baptised by him, he had a voice of authority and he used his voice to tell people to turn away from sin and be baptised as a sign of repentance. One day, Jesus came to the River Jordan to be baptised by John. John, however, felt unqualified for such a task, but finally agreed and baptised Jesus. Jesus was baptised and set an example to his followers to take part in this ritual.

John the Baptist's death came after his arrest by order of King Herod, John was an outspoken individual and he told King Herod he should not have married his brother's wife. Unfortunately encouraged by his daughter and wife, King Herod beheaded John despite him being known by his people as a prophet. The Feast of St John the Baptist is celebrated to remember his commitment to God and to remind Christians to repent for their sins and understand the importance of his prophet.



FEAST DAY OF SAINT THOMAS MORE

JUNE 22, 2022: This week we also celebrate the feast of St. Thomas More, born in London in 1478. He studied law and entered Parliament in 1504. When Henry VIII and his wife Katherine of Aragón had no children, Henry divorced her and married Anne Boleyn so that there would be heirs to the throne. Parliament passed a law forcing clergy to acknowledge Henry as the supreme head of the Church. Thomas More refused to do so and resigned as Lord Chancellor. He was aware that just because something is lawful does not mean it is morally right.

When Thomas refused to take the oath, he was imprisoned in the Tower of London and later beheaded on July 6th 1535. His final words were, I am "The King's good servant, but God's first." He was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1935. **BOTH JOHN THE BAPTIST AND THOMAS MORE** remind us that just because certain behavior is enshrined in the law of the land does not mean that it is morally right. Fix our eyes on Jesus. "He must increase; I must decrease." St. Thomas More is the patron saint of adopted children lawyers, civil servants, politicians, and difficult marriages.

PRAYER BY ST. THOMAS MORE: *Good Lord, give me the grace so to spend my life that when the day of my death shall come, though I feel pain in my body, I may feel comfort in my soul and – with faithful hope of Your mercy, in due love towards You and charity towards the world – I may, through Your grace, depart hence into Your glory.*
