32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. And their prayer offered in faith will heal the sick. and the Lord will make them well. And anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." James 5:14,15

SUFFERING AND ILLNESS have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. Christians feel and experience pain as do all other people; yet their faith helps them to grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering and to bear their pain with greater courage. From Christ's words they know that sickness has meaning and value for their own salvation and for the salvation of the world. They also know that Christ, who during his life often visited and healed the sick, loves them in their illness.

If one member suffers in the Body of Christ, which is the Church. all members suffer with that member (1 Cor 12:26). For this reason, kindness shown toward the sick and works of charity and mutual help for the relief of every kind of human want are held in special honor. Every scientific effort to prolong life and every act of care for the sick, on the part of any person, may be considered a preparation for the Gospel and a sharing in Christ's healing ministry.

It is thus especially fitting that all baptized Christians share in this ministry of mutual charity within the Body of Christ by doing all that they can to help the sick return to health, by showing love for the sick, and by celebrating the sacraments with them. Like the other sacraments, these too have a community aspect, which should be brought out as much as possible when they are celebrated.



PASTORAL CARE, eternal life, immortality of the soul and the resurrection of the body are central beliefs of Catholic Christians. Because of that we profess hope in the face of sickness and death, and seek to act with charity to work with families during sickness and grief to provide comfort and consolation.

SACRAMENTS OF THE SICK include:

Reconciliation (Confession) – for a priest to celebrate the sacrament with you. Eucharist - Lay ministers may bring the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist on a regular basis to homes, hospitals and elders lodges. It is vitally important therefore, that the St. Regis Mission Rectory office knows your wish to receive the Eucharist. The Mission office (Father Jerome Pastores) makes the Communion list and visits are scheduled accordingly. When requesting a pastoral visit be specific as to whether the need is for anointing or the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Important Information about the SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

- It is no longer a sacrament solely for the dying.
- It should be administered at the beginning of an illness if possible. The St. Regis Mission Rectory office should be contacted as soon as possible before an emergency situation arises or worsens.
- It may be administered in a hospital, health care facility, in a home or during a parish communal celebration.
- Not all illnesses are physical in nature. Many times our emotional and psychological health is in need of the healing grace of the Sacrament.
