MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE OF OTTAWA-**CORNWALL CHRISTMAS 2022** Dear faithful of the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall,

The season of Christmas is once again upon us. How we decide to welcome it and celebrate it is of utter importance. Many in our world today live under the many pressures of society. of work and family

obligations and, of course, of personal challenges. The "busyness" of our lives can easily overwhelm us and steer us off course. So, in what space will you be when Christmas arrives?

Obviously, we remain attentive to upcoming events if they mean something for us. If they are of little importance, or if they are likely not going to change anything in my life, chances are I will let them pass by without notice.
