## **JANUARY 1, 2023** MARY. THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

Today we celebrate the Motherhood of Mary, an aspect of the life of Our Lady that many of us can relate to. In today's Gospel, shepherds visit Mary, Joseph, and Jesus and reveal to them that Jesus is the Messiah. Mary ponders this. She has known from the beginning who Jesus is, but now he is a newborn, her own child lying serenely beside her. It could have hit home that she doesn't really know what "Messiah" means for him and for their family. She could have been afraid. She could have been worried. She could have immediately started to plan for eventualities. We all might have done these things. Yet, Mary ponders with her heart rather than her mind.

She is able to treasure the shepherds' words. She recognizes that God's plan is a beautiful gift. As she has always done, she looks to the future with peace and confidence, despite not knowing all that it holds. She can do this because she trusts God and gives him his rightful place – as the one in control of the future.
