#### **EASTER SUNDAY**

## ARCHBISHOP MARCEL'S EASTER MESSAGE

You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you. (Mark 16,

6-7) I retain three key messages in this passage from the Gospel of Saint Mark, read at the Easter Vigil. First of all, just when the women thought they were entering the world of death, since they were going to embalm the body of Jesus in the tomb, they are told great news: Jesus has risen! What a surprise! For God, nothing is impossible. In the midst of our distress, our suffering, our darkness, the risen Christ reveals himself to us even today.

Not having had the chance to study the case, to verify the facts, to see for themselves that Jesus had really risen, they are immediately sent as messengers of the Good News. We too are messengers of the Good News, given the same mission as these women. Moved by the Spirit, let us not hesitate to be bearers of the joy of the Gospel. Let us not wait to have all the answers to our questions to witness to our faith.

The third key message is more subtle but carries great hope. "He goes before you into Galilee." "Galilee" is the place where the disciples live, it is their "home". The good news of the resurrection will be announced to them on their own ground. Jesus goes before them and meets them in their living and working environment, in all the events of their daily lives.

Jesus also meets us in our own "Galilee", where we are physically, but also spiritually. He does not wait for us to be perfect Christians to enter a relationship with us. He goes before us every moment, here and now, and walks with us, as he did with the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Will we be able to recognize him and be witnesses of his transforming presence?

MARY MAGDALENE stood weeping at the tomb where the body of Jesus had been placed. She needed to be there – in fact, she went twice – just as she had needed to stand at the foot of the cross with his mother as he died. Her loss was greater and her sorrow was deeper than any fear that she might be arrested for being his follower. And then, Easter! Mary Magdalene was the first to experience Jesus

Christ, risen from the dead. He commissioned her to be an evangelist to his Apostles – the bearer of good news – so they could share the truth of Jesus Christ, Son of God, with all people to the ends of the earth. That same good news is now entrusted to each one of us, to share with the people in our lives. The Scriptures and prayers of the 50 days of Easter are rich and strong. The Gospels offer the challenges of living each day as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, who came to show us the Way. God's great love for each and every person has no expiry date. God our Creator, our Redeemer and our Sustainer never tires of holding us in life and love. This is the wonder of Easter. Alleluia! Christ is risen!

#### MESSAGE FROM BISHOP NOËL SIMARD FOR EASTER 2023 EASTER: TO RENEW OUR HOPE FOR A BETTER LIFE

In the winter that our world and the

Church are currently going through, where can we hang our hope when the ground where we walk seems to be cracking and slipping away from our feet? How can we remain firm in our hopes and refuse to be shaken by external shocks such as war, inflation, the financial and economic crisis, the many natural disasters, attacks on life such as euthanasia, misery and the displacement of so many people? After a Lent which has prepared us to live the cross of Christ with faith, hope and charity, we celebrate his Easter, the victory of life over death, of light over darkness.

In his message for the Easter celebrations of 2019, Pope Francis invited us not to give in "to resignation and failure", calling for "a Church renewed and rejuvenated by Christ". May Easter give us the impetus to believe in a better tomorrow, new eyes to see the signs of life around us, and the audacity to bring our hands, our hearts and our whole being to building a world of peace, love, light and life! With Christ, let's do something new and together let His life burst forth!
