

#### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. She responded to the life-changing news by simply replying with trust in God's providence: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." As we reflect upon the Solemnity of the Annunciation, may we, like Mary, always say yes to God's plans for us. The Annunciation marks the actual incarnation of Jesus Christ - the moment that Jesus was conceived and that the Son of God became the son of the Virgin.

RECONCILIATION: It's not easy to walk in the Lord's footsteps never was and never will be. The winds of sin can gradually blow us off course, and without even realizing it, we can sail in a direction contrary to our baptismal commitment. Years ago, the notion of a long look at the whole direction of our life (particularly the "why" behind the sins we confess) was far from people's minds – except for people who had been away from the sacraments for a long time and needed to make a "general confession." Everyone else simply dealt with individual fix-its, a clean up before going to Communion. The Church is now returning to the earlier tradition of celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation by centering on baptism and personal conversion. This requires deep reflection and much longer preparation. Lent is the time when we do this. Lent is a time of conversion. It all starts on Ash Wednesday, when the ashes are placed on our foreheads with the words, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel." It all ends on Easter Sunday when we reach into the baptismal water and renew our "yes" to the Lord's invitation to "Come, follow me."

THE IMPORTANCE OF CONFESSION: Not only does the Sacrament of Penance free us from our sins but it also challenges us to have the same kind of compassion and forgiveness for those who sin against us. We are liberated to be forgivers. We obtain new insight into the words of the Prayer of St. Francis: "It is in pardoning that we are pardoned." Jesus entrusted the ministry of reconciliation to the Church. The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God. It is a holy moment in which we place ourselves in his presence and honestly acknowledge our sins, especially mortal sins. With absolution, we are reconciled to God and the Church. The Sacrament helps us stay close to the truth that we cannot live without God. "In him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28)

HOLY WEEK: Holy Week is the most sacred week in the liturgical year in Christianity. Holy Week occurs the week after Lazarus Saturday and starts on the evening of Palm Sunday. Holy Week

comprises of Palm Sunday – entrance into Jerusalem; Holy Wednesday – into the darkness; Maundy Thursday - the Last Supper commemorating Jesus' washing of His disciples' feet; Good Friday – Jesus' agony on the cross; Holy Saturday – visiting the tomb of Jesus. **Holy week is April 2 - 8, 2023.** 



**GIFT OF FORGIVENESS**: Jesus gives forgiveness as a gift to people who don't do anything in particular to earn it, and to some people who don't seem to deserve it. He also forgives here and now – so a

person no longer has to live with sin. Forgiveness was a gift Jesus was happy to give. It was the first thing he did for the paralytic. He wanted to do it for many others - if they would only let him. When we think about it, we experience the same thing ourselves when we give the gift of forgiveness. It is a relief, and we feel so much better when we forgive. It's always a joy to give a gift to someone you love. Sometimes we may look upon giving forgiveness as though we were heroic, or fulfilling a difficult duty, or paternalistically handing out something to someone in need. Actually, we are the ones who are very much in need, and we fulfill that need when we forgive. We get more out of forgiveness than the person we forgive. It is the good news of this Gospel, and especially appropriate during Lent. On the Fifth Sunday of Lent we should remember what the Angel Gabriel said to Mary ("Nothing shall be impossible for God") and to make the last days of Lent a time of extraordinary prayer and forgiveness.



## **SAINT ISIDORE OF SEVILLE APRIL 4**:

Born in Cartagena an amazingly learned man, Isidore, was sometimes called "The Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages" because the encyclopedia he wrote was used as a textbook for nine centuries.

He required seminaries to be built in every diocese, wrote a Rule for religious orders, and founded schools that taught every branch of learning. Isidore wrote numerous books, including a dictionary, an encyclopedia, a history of Goths, and a history of the world—beginning with creation! He continued his austerities even as he approached age 80. During the last six months of his life, he increased his charities so much that his house was crowded from morning till night with the poor of the countryside.
