#### **FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**



The readings for the 4th Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday) remind us that Jesus Christ leads us through the gate of salvation. In the first reading

Peter calls all to conversion. The psalm reminds us that God is always caring for us as a shepherd cares for his sheep. The second reading tells us that when we stray, we can return to the Lord. And in the gospel Jesus promises to lead his people to safety and warns us to be cautious about who we follow.

That is what it is all about -- getting people to face Jesus and ask him: 'Lord, what do you want me to do?' FEAST OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA MAY 13: This title was given to the Blessed Virgin Mary after she appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal between May 13, and October 13, 1917. The three messages or "secrets" of Fatima stress the importance of repentance, conversion of heart and dedication to our Lady, especially through daily prayer of the Rosary. Prayer to Our Lady of Fatima: We

implore you, inspire in our hearts a fervent love for the

recitation of the Rosary. By meditating on the mysteries of the redemption that are recalled therein may we obtain the graces and virtues that we ask, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer.
