THE MONTH OF MAY IS DEDICATED TO THE

BLESSED VIRGIN MARY. Remember to offer a family rosary every day of this month in remembrance of the Blessed Mother of God. THE FAMILY THAT PRAYS TOGETHER, STAYS TOGETHER.



The readings for the 6th Sunday of Easter remind us that God is always with us and always caring for us, no matter where we are or what the circumstance. The first reading tells of how Peter and John went from Jerusalem to Samaria to pray with the people there and call down the Holy Spirit on them. The psalm is our response to God's loving care for us. The second reading tells us that Christ suffered for all of us, righteous and sinners alike. And in the gospel, Jesus tells us that he has not abandoned us. He has sent the Holy Spirit to be with us always.

Jesus stresses the importance of obedience to His commandments as a demonstration of our love for Him. The gospel highlights the fact that true faith is not just a matter of belief but also requires a commitment to living a life that is pleasing to God, following the example set by Jesus.

Jesus promises His disciples that He will send them the Holy Spirit, who will be with them forever. The gospel emphasizes the importance of the Holy Spirit in the life of a believer, as the Spirit guides and empowers us to live out our faith and remain connected to Christ.



THEME OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR THE 57th WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL **COMMUNICATIONS 2023 "Speak with the** heart: Veritatem facientes in caritate" (Speaking the truth in love). Speak with the heart: Veritatem facientes in caritate" (Doing the truth in charity) is the theme for World Day of Social Communications 2023. The World Day of Social Communications will be celebrated on 21 May 2023. The theme, which connects with that of 2022 - "Listen with the ear of the heart" is intended to form part of

the path that will lead the entire Church to the celebration of the Synod in October 2023. Speaking with the heart, means giving "a reason for your hope" and by doing so gently, "using the gift of communication as a bridge and not as a wall." It is an invitation to "go against the grain" at a time characterized by polarization and heated debates that exacerbate tempers - even in ecclesial life.

The theme further invites everyone not to "fear to state the at times uncomfortable truth that finds its foundation in the Gospel." This proclamation, however, must not be separated from "a style of mercy, of sincere participation in the joys and sufferings of people of our time," as shown in the dialogue between the mysterious wayfarer and the disciples of Emmaus in the Bible.

Pope Francis' theme for the World Communications Day is a call for a peaceful dialogue that allows for uncomfortable truths to be spoken of without resorting to contentious and hostile debate. Speaking the truth "means giving 'a reason for your hope' and doing so gently, using the gift of communication as a bridge." Each year, the Vatican and many dioceses mark World Communications Day on the Sunday before **Pentecost**; in 2023. The pope's choice for the theme is: "Speak with the heart: Veritatem facientes in caritate" (Speaking the truth in love).
