ASCENSION OF THE LORD THE SOLEMNITY OF THE



ASCENSION OF THE LORD (MAY 18), For 40 days after his resurrection on Easter Sunday, the Bible says that Jesus travelled and preached with his apostles, preparing them for his departure from Earth. Ascension Day marks the moment Jesus literally

ascended into heaven before his disciples, at the village of Bethany, near Jerusalem. The time came for him to return to heaven to prepare a place for us, as his earthly ministry had been fulfilled. The Ascension serves as an ultimate demonstration of Jesus' power over death, inaugurating his reign over heaven and earth as the Living King, For many Christians, the fact that Jesus' followers witnessed him ascending into the clouds leaves no doubt that Jesus is alive and with God the Father in Heaven, and is no longer limited to living on Earth. The Ascension of the Lord is followed 10 days later by the feast of Pentecost. It was Christ's ascension that made Pentecost possible. "It is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you," Jesus told his disciples. (John 16:7) But he promised: "I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) To help you prepare for the feast of Pentecost, consider praying a novena to the Holy Spirit that can be prayed daily from the Friday after Ascension Thursday to the vigil of Pentecost.

THE FIRST HOLY EUCHARIST The Eucharist is a special part of the Catholic mass as this

represents the presence of Jesus in the Church. The wine represents his blood and the bread his body. During a child's First Holy Communion it is their first time partaking in the Eucharist and accepting Jesus in their lives.

It is in this holy sacrament that children are more aware of their faith. During First Holy Communion they are making a conscious journey in faith and love of Christ.

During the act of Communion, Jesus is present during the mass and each mass is a celebration of devotion and faith. Once a child partakes in the Eucharist they are a full member of the Church.

AN IMPORTANT SACRAMENT FOR EVERY ROMAN

CATHOLIC A child goes through different sacraments. First is their baptism as infants where they are absolved of their original sins from birth, next is the Sacrament of Reconciliation where the child goes for their first confession. This is a form of spiritual healing to cleanse the soul to prepare for the next sacrament First Holy Communion.
