FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



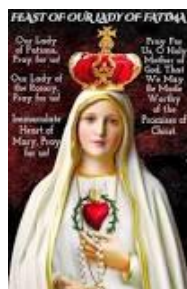

This is what Jesus is calling us to when he says, "love one another." We are to take care of one another's needs, pray for one another, and seek the best for one another, which ultimately is found in faith in God. Reflect on who you need to love better than you have. Then, reach out to them in Christ's love.
