

THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHIRST SUNDAY



"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." (John 6)

Blood of Christ, also known as the Most Precious Blood, in Christian theology refers to the physical blood actually shed by Jesus Christ primarily on the Cross, and the salvation which Christianity teaches was accomplished thereby, or the sacramental blood (wine) present in the Eucharist or Lord's Supper.

The Precious Blood of Jesus is the

price paid for our redemption, the source of our justification, and the foundation of our hope. It flows freely from the pierced side of Christ and is offered again every day through the holy sacrifice of the Mass. May we cherish our salvation and the hope of eternal glory.

The Eucharist – the Body and Blood of Christ – is God's great gift of love to us. It is a sacrament of love. In it we receive the very person of the risen Christ. The Lord nourishes us in the Eucharist, giving us food for our faith journey.

We can consider the Eucharist from a variety of perspectives: It is the true presence of Christ. Not just a symbol. Jesus did not say at the Last Supper, "This is like my body; this is like my blood." He said, "This is my body; this is my blood." Broken and poured out for you.

The spiritual nourishment we receive in the Eucharist (even in spiritual communion) draws us closer to Christ in friendship. It helps us to fight against temptation and helps us to be bread for others. The sacrificial character of the Eucharist – Christ's passion and death, seen in reference to his blood being poured out – helps us to carry whatever crosses come our way.

The Eucharist builds community, fosters unity as St. Paul teaches in his first letter to the Corinthians: "Because the loaf of bread is one, we though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf." St. Thomas Aquinas taught that the Eucharist has three major components: memory of the past, a present grace, and hope of eternal life.

By consuming the Body and Blood of Christ, man bears within himself, already on this earth, the seed of eternal life, for the Eucharist is the sacrament of life in God. Christ says: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." (Jn 6:57).

THE MEANING OF TH SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

The Church teaches that confirmation is necessar because it enriches the person with the strength of the Holy Spirit to build

up the Church and to be witnesses of Christ to others.

Confirmation completes Baptism. It is as if the Bishop seals and approves the Baptism celebrated earlier in life. It represents a personal commitment to grow in the knowledge, love, and practice of our faith. When you are confirmed, you gain a new identity as a full member of the Church.

It confirms and deepens the grace of Baptism. Baptism brought us into a relationship with God and made us His children. Confirmation strengthens us to live out our Baptism the world.

Through confirmation the effects are it increases sanctifying grace, roots us more deeply as children of God, unites us mor firmly to Christ, renders our bond with the Church more perfec and Increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit within us.

The Sacrament of Confirmation consists of the renewal of baptismal promises and the laying on of hands and anointing with the oil of Chrism.

Confirmed people experience a growth in the spiritual gifts the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, right judgment, courage, knowledge, reverence, and wonder and awe. These gifts help them grow deeper spiritually, in order to deepen thei faith and grow closer to God.

The Roman Catholic Church views confirmation as a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ. It confers the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord) upon the recipient, who must be a baptized person at least seven years old.

<u>PRAYER</u>: Holy Spirit, confirm in me. Holy Spirit, you are the giver of many gifts which God wants to give me very personally. Open my heart and my mind as I prepare for Confirmation. Help me to know that you are confirming all the goodness that I am, and all the goodness that I will become. AMEN
