

FEAST DAY OF SAINT THOMAS

MORE JUNE 22, St Thomas More's feast day is June 22nd, and he is the patron saint of adopted children, lawyers, civil servants, politicians and difficult marriages. Thomas is famous for having doubted the Resurrection of Jesus and for demanding physical proof of the wounds of Christ's Crucifixion. The phrase "doubting Thomas" was coined for his lack of faith. When Jesus showed him the wounds, St. Thomas became the first person to explicitly acknowledge the divinity of Jesus.

Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe" (John 20:26-27, NIV)

Thomas More is known for his 1516 book 'Utopia'. He died in 1535 after he was executed by King Henry VIII who was the head of the Church of England. Thomas was born in 1478 to Sir John More, a successful lawyer and a judge, and his mother was Agnes. He was the second born of six siblings.

After refusing to take the Oath of Supremacy, he was convicted of treason and executed. On his execution, he was reported to have said: "I die the King's good servant, and God's first". Pope Pius XI canonised More in 1935 as a martyr.

Today we know Sir Thomas More primarily as the author of Utopia, and as one of the more famous martyrs of Henry VIII's reign. The popular image is of a man – principled, steadfast, courageous – who placed his own conscience above his king's demands. His "golden little book" Utopia has earned him greater fame than the crown of martyrdom or the million words of his English works.

Fathers have a hand in teaching their children life skills, guiding smart life choices and, in early life, providing a sense of safety. 


FEAST OF THE SACRED
HEART JUNE 16: The Feast
of the Sacred Heart is
observed on June 16, 2023.
The Feast of the Sacred
Heart (properly the Solemnity
of the Most Sacred Heart of
Jesus) is a solemnity in the
liturgical calendar of the

Roman Catholic Church. It falls 19 days after Pentecost, on a Friday. The Feast of the Sacred Heart has been in the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar since 1856

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is one of the most widely practiced and well-known devotions, taking Jesus' physical heart as the representation of his divine love for humanity. This devotion is predominantly used in the Catholic Church and among some High-Church Anglicans and Lutherans. The devotion especially emphasizes the unmitigated love, compassion, and long-suffering of the heart of Christ towards humanity.

The Sacred Heart is often depicted in Christian art as a flaming heart shining with divine light, pierced by the lancewound, encircled by the crown of thorns, surmounted by a cross and bleeding. Sometimes the image is shown shining within the bosom of Christ with his wounded hands pointing at the heart.
