AUGUST MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



August is the month traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In 1944 Venerable Pope Pius XII set this feast to be celebrated on Aug. 22 as the Octave of the Assumption. He did so that by her intercession may be obtained "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue." In the Catholic Church, each month of the year is dedicated to a particular devotion — in August it's the Immaculate Heart of Mary, in addition to the Assumption of

Mary on August 15, other feast days are devoted to Mary which include Our Lady of the Angels on August 2. We know that traditionally May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. October to the Holy Rosary, and Our Lady of the Rosary. Now August is the month traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. PRAYER: O Mary, Virgin most powerful and Mother of mercy, Queen of Heaven and Refuge of sinners, we consecrate ourselves to thine Immaculate Heart. We consecrate to thee our very being and our whole life; all that we have, all that we love, all that we are.



THE PAPAL VISIT: ONE YEAR LATER

As we recall Pope Francis made a pastoral visit to Canada last July 24 to 29, 2022. An indigenous delegation from the Archdiocese of Ottawa Cornwall and

from Akwesasne attended the Pope's Visit in Quebec City on July 27-28, 2022. The Pope's visit provided a unique opportunity for him to listen and dialogue with Indigenous Peoples, to express his heartfelt apology and to address the impact of colonization and the participation of the Catholic Church in the operation of residential schools throughout Canada.



The papal visit also provided an opportunity for the shepherd of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics to connect with the Indigenous Catholic community in Canada. We witnessed through the Pope's visit

how the Catholic Church has a responsibility to take genuine and meaningful steps to journey with Indigenous Peoples on the lengthy path to healing and reconciliation. Through this historic journey of Pope Francis to Canada, we have witnessed a significant step on the road to truth, understanding and healing. One year later it is an important time to reflect and pray for positive outcomes from the visit of the Holy Father during those special days that he spent among us.

VATICAN NEWS AUGUST 1-6, 2023 IS WORLD YOUTH DAY

Pope Francis released his prayer intention for the month of August, which is dedicated to the World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal. Young

people are invited by Pope Francis to set aside fear and embark on a joyful journey to bear witness to Christ in our world. The theme of the World Youth Day is "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39) which is the bible quote chosen by Pope Francis as the motto of the World Youth Day that will be held for the first time in the capital city of Lisbon. Portugal. What is the purpose of World Youth Day? Both international and domestic World Youth Day celebrations are important for three reasons: first, celebrating and putting trust in the young; second, making pilgrimage; and third, encountering the Catholic community. World Youth Day is accompanied and represented by two symbols: the pilgrim cross and the icon of Our Lady Salus Populi Romani. The international World Youth Day celebration takes place every 2-3 years, typically in the summer months and on a major scale. The international festival of faith in Portugal in August 2023 will be a chance for pilgrims around the world to come together with young people from every continent to pray, worship, and celebrate the Catholic faith.
