FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION, AUGUST 6:

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord honors when the apostles get their first real glimpse of Jesus in his ultimate

glory. The Transfiguration of Christ is the culminating point of His public life, as His Baptism is its starting point, and His Ascension its end. The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ is celebrated each year on August 6. The feast commemorates the transfiguration or metamorphosis of Christ on Mount Tabor, when our Lord appeared in His divine glory before the Apostles Peter, James, and John. The experience of the Transfiguration is meant to point forward to the sufferings Jesus is about to experience. It is meant to strengthen the disciples faith, revealing to them in a powerful way the divine hand that is at work in the events Jesus will undergo. The Apostles' experience at the Transfiguration reminds us that no matter how powerful a spiritual experience is, the time comes when we have to come down off the mountain and rejoin our everyday life. But when we do so, we need to do it as a changed person. The term transfiguration comes from Latin meaning, "to change or transform." A transformation involving our Savior takes place on a mountaintop — an event that glorifies the divine person of Jesus, one that is recorded in the three synoptic Gospels and by St. Peter in 2 Peter, 1:16-20. **Prayer for the Feast of the Transfiguration:** *O God, who in the glorious Transfiguration of your Only Begotten Son confirmed the mysteries of faith by the witness of the Fathers and wonderfully prefigured our full adoption to sonship, grant, we pray, to your servants, that, listening to the voice of your beloved Son, we may merit to become co-heirs with him.*



FEAST OF OUR LADY OF THE SNOWS:

AUGUST 5TH, Our Lady of the Snow, FEAST OF ("Dedicatio Sanctae Mariae ad Nives"), is a feast celebrated on August 5 to commemorate the dedication of the church of Santa Maria Maggiore on the Esquiline Hill in Rome. Mariæ" or "Mariæ Majoris"; since the seventh century was known also as "Maria ad Præsepe". The appellation "ad Nives" (of the snow) originated a few hundred years later, as did the legend which

gave this name to the church. Devotion to Our Lady of the Snows has direct ties to the legend about a marvelous snowfall in Rome in 352 A.D. Mary had indicated in a dream to a wealthy, childless Roman couple that she wanted a church built in her honor and the site for this church would be covered with snow. **PRAYER TO OUR LADY OF THE SNOWS:** *Grant, good Mother, to the faithful Bishops of the Church the grace to defend Her Sacred Teachings, and to persevere courageously against all the enemies of the Holy Church. Amen.*
