### **VETERANS DAY NOV 11, 2023**

American Indians and Alaska Natives (Al/AN) serve in the U.S. Armed Services at a higher rate than any other group. There are currently more than 140,000 Al/AN Veterans living in the United States. This month, we especially recognize the immeasurable contribution of American Indians and Alaska Natives who serve in

the Armed Forces at five times the national average. We also acknowledge the many American Indians and Alaska Natives who are members of Federal, State, local, and tribal law enforcement and who sacrifice their safety for the security of all. NIAWEN:KOWA.



# FACTS ABOUT NATIVE AMERICANS AND THE CATHOLIC CHURCH: According to the U.S. Census Bureau, approximately 2.9 million people identified themselves as Native

Americans or Alaska Natives in the year 2008. Of this total, it is estimated that 580,000 are Roman

Catholics. More than 340 parishes in the United States serve predominantly Native American congregations. Most of those ministering to Native American Catholics are members of religious orders; those most likely to be Native American themselves are lay ministers and deacons. Currently, one archdiocese is headed by a bishop of Native American ancestry. St. Kateri Tekakwitha, Lily of the Mohawks, is the first Native American saint in the United States and Canada. She is a symbol of the link between Catholicism and the indigenous peoples of Canada and the USA. St. Kateri Tekakwitha pray for us.
