and recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and sacrifice.

Christ was the first to be sent, as a 'missionary' of the Father (Jn 20:21), and as such, he is the Father's 'faithful witness' As described by Pope John Paul II, World Mission Sunday is "an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration and for all the missions of the world"

The theme the pope chose for the 2023 celebration is "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," which he said was inspired by the story of Jesus and the disciples on the road to Emmaus after the resurrection.

<u>PRAYER</u>: For missionaries of all vocations who live in a missionary key and show great courage and joy in proclaiming the Gospel in all lands, may the testimony of the authentic Christian life build strong communities of missionary disciples around the world. We pray to the Lord.



FEAST OF ST. TERESA OF AVILA –
OCTOBER 15: ST. TERESA (1515-1582)

October 15th is the Feast of Saint Teresa of Ávila. She was the first female Doctor of the Church. She was a Carmelite Nun credited with many fantastic quotes. Teresa of Avila is the patron saint of those who suffer from headaches and migraines, those who are ill, people ridiculed for their religious faith, and Spain. As a mystic, Teresa was bombarded with supernatural experiences and visions. Jesus once said to her in a vision, "I would create the universe again

just to hear you say that you love me." Saint Teresa suffered from poor health for most of her life, but that did not stop her from filling her every waking hour with productivity. Teresa founded a total of over thirteen monasteries during her lifetime. **PRAYER:** O Most Loving Lord Jesus Christ: We thank You for, "The great gift of love," which You granted to Your beloved Teresa. We pray that, by Your merits and by those of Your most loving spouse Teresa, we will receive the great crowning gift of Your perfect love.



CANONIZATION OF ST KATERI TEKAKWITHA:

Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks", Kateri Tekakwitha was born in 1656 in Ossemenon (today Auriesville, New York) She died of tuberculosis on April 17, 1680, shortly before her 24th birthday, and was buried at St. Francis Xavier Mission. Her

final words were: "Jesos Konoronkwa" ("Jesus, I love you). Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012, in Rome. She is popularly venerated as a patroness of ecology. St. Kateri Tekakwitha pray for us.
