FEAST OF GUARDIAN ANGELS

The Feast of Guardian Angels was first authorized in 1608 by Pope Paul V, in honor of guardian angels. In the 1670s, the then Pope, Pope Clement X

made October 2 the official date for the Feast of Guardian Angels, which was also made an obligatory double feast. Guardian angels are first and foremost doing God's will. Our guardian angel is in constant communication with God and intercedes for us on our behalf to the heavenly court. Their mission is to do whatever they can to protect our souls, help that person avoid sin and spiritual dangers and gain entrance to heaven. Whatever you do to celebrate a feast day, make sure it always includes extra prayers of some kind. On the guardian angel feast day, the prayer to guardian angels is a good one to pray. *O God, who in your unfathomable providence are pleased to send your holy Angels to guard us, hear our supplication as we cry to you, that we may always be defended by their protection and rejoice eternally in their company.*



THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

formerly known as Feast of Our Lady of Victory and Feast of the Holy Rosary is celebrated on October 7 in the General Roman Calendar. The month

of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. Mary promises that if you pray the Rosary faithfully, you will have the light of God shining upon you and you will have many rewards in heaven like the saints. Recitation of the Rosary is important because it brings us closer to Jesus. Over time, consistent recitation of the Rosary is a guaranteed way to become the saint God wants you to be. *If you say the Rosary faithfully until death, I do assure you that, in spite of the gravity of your sins, you shall receive a never fading crown of glory.* **PRAYER:** O God, whose only-begotten Son, by his life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech you, that we who meditate upon these mysteries of the most holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise.

During the month of October, there will be a recitation of the Rosary before Mass at the St. Regis Mission each weekend. The Family Rosary is a powerful prayer to ask Our Blessed Mother to protect our families and preserve each with love and unity.
