OUR LADY OF SORROWS:

SEPTEMBER 15th: The Catholic Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15, the day after the feast of the Holy Cross to show the close connection between Jesus' Passion and Mary's Sorrows. This advocation has its roots in the Gospel.

Our Lady of Sorrows is often depicted with either one or seven swords piercing her heart, the first a reference to the prophecy of Simeon, the second to the

Seven Sorrows.

The Seven Sorrows (or *Dolors*) are events in the life of Mary. Traditionally, the Seven Sorrows are: 1) **The Prophecy** of Simeon in Luke 2; 2) **The Flight into Egypt** in Matthew 2; 3) **The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem**, also in Luke 2; 4) **Mary meeting Jesus on the Via Dolorosa**, the Fourth Station of the cross 5) **The Crucifixion of Jesus on Mount Calvary** in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and especially John 19; 6) **Jesus's Descent from the Cross** in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19; and 7) **The Burial of Jesus** also in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19.

The traditional devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary. Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can.

By honouring Our Lady under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows on this day, we remember the sacrifice that Christ made for us, and we are united with his Holy Mother in her grief for the sins of the world that led to the crucifixion of her Son.

Mary, under her title of "Our Lady of Sorrows", is the patron saint of Slovakia, the Congregation of Holy Cross, Mola di Bari and the Molise region of Italy, Mississippi (in the United States), Dolores, Abra, (in the Philippines) and Lanzarote (in the Canary Islands).

PRAYER: O Mary, you truly became the Queen of all martyrs as these seven bitter swords of sorrow pierced your Immaculate Heart! By the merits of your tearful distress obtain for us and for all sinners the graces of perfect contrition and conversion. Amen.
