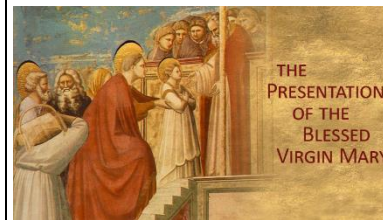

NOVEMBER 21, FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF MARY

The Feast of the Presentation of Mary celebrates the day when St. Joachim and St. Anne brought their daughter, who would become the Blessed

Virgin, to the Temple in Jerusalem, to consecrate her to God. The Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrated annually on November 21st, commemorates the presentation of the Blessed Virgin as a child by her parents in the Temple in Jerusalem. Before Mary's birth, her parents received a heavenly message that they would bear a child. The Presentation of Mary reminds us that we can go on a pilgrimage of thanksgiving, to give thanks to God for a blessing received. In their gratitude, Joachim and Anne pledged to dedicate Mary to God and give her to His service in the temple. To carry this out, it meant they had to make sacrifice and go on pilgrimage. What we celebrate on this day is the fact that God chose to dwell in Mary in a very special way. In response, Mary placed her whole self at the service of God.



THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE
