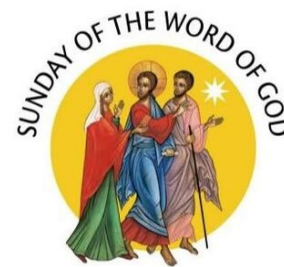

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD: The Sunday of the Word of God



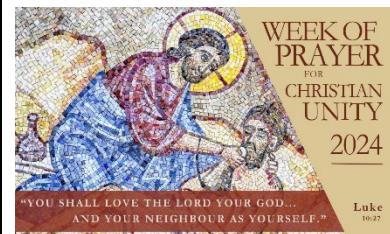
is an annual commemoration in the Catholic Church taking place on the third Sunday in Ordinary Time, during January. **This year's theme is 'We are not alone'**, inspired by Pope Francis' Synod on Synodality as we journey forward as one Church. It also reminds us that God is always with us. The 16th Ordinary General Assembly

of the Synod of Bishops, commonly referred to as the synod on synodality, is an ongoing synod of bishops of the Catholic Church which will conclude in October 2024 and has as its theme "For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission".

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God.

This *Sunday of the Word of God* is a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the *Sunday of the Word of God* has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity. The Bible is the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity. **The word of God unites believers and makes them one people.** When we take time to pray and meditate on the sacred text, we can speak from the heart and thus reach the hearts of those who hear us, conveying what is essential and capable of bearing fruit. **May we never tire of devoting time and prayer to Scripture, so that it may be received "not as a human word but as what it really is, the word of God" (1 Thess 2:13).**

May the Sunday of the Word of God help our people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: "This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (*Dt* 30:14).



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity [WPCU] is an annual global ecumenical celebration (traditionally held January 18-25 in the northern hemisphere).

Christians around the world are invited to pray for the unity of all the baptized; to reflect together on Scripture; to participate in jointly-organized worship services; and to share in acts of outreach and fellowship. The theme for 2024 is drawn from Luke 10:27: **"You shall love the Lord your God...and your neighbour as yourself."** This annual observance, sponsored jointly by the World Council of Churches and the Pontifical Council for Christian Unity since 1968, invites all Christians everywhere to remember one another in prayer and strengthen the bonds of love and mutual mission we share in Jesus Christ.

UNITY PRAYER: God grant us the patience to work together, bring us all together as a family. Let us work together with understanding and compassion in our hearts. Let us not be rude or arrogant towards one another, as we light the way to your heavenly kingdom.

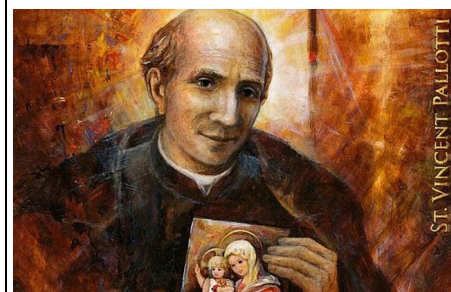
THE LORD'S PRAYER (in Mohawk)

ST. FRANCIS DE SALES FEAST DAY: JANUARY 24TH: Francis de Sales was beatified in 1661 by Pope Alexander VII, who then canonized him four years later. He

was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1877. The Roman Catholic Church celebrates Saint Francis de Sales' feast on 24 January, the day of his burial in Annecy in 1624. In 1923 Pope Pius XI named Francis patron saint of writers. He was educated at the Jesuit college of Clermont in Paris (1580–88) and at Padua, Italy, where he received a doctorate in law (1591). St. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in Roman Catholic history. He founded the Franciscan orders, including the Poor Clares and the lay Third Order. He and St. Catherine of Siena are the patron saints of Italy, and he is also the patron saint of ecology and of animals. **PRAYER: Have patience with all things, but chiefly have patience with yourself. Do not lose courage in considering your own imperfections, but instantly set about remedying them — every day begin the task anew.**



ST. VINCENT PALLOTTI FEAST - JANUARY 22ND Born in Rome in 1795, St. Vincent became a priest and dedicated himself completely to God and caring for souls. He dreamed of gaining for Christ all non-Catholics,

especially the Mohammedans. To this end he inaugurated a revolutionary program which envisaged the collaboration of the laity in the apostolate of the clergy. But St. Vincent was also well aware of the many deprivations in the natural sphere that hindered the spread of the Faith. He thus obtained and spent huge sums for the poor and underprivileged. He founded guilds for workers, agriculture schools, loan associations, orphanages and homes for girls - all of which made him the pioneer and precursor of Catholic Action. His great legacy was the congregation which he founded for urban mission work, known as the "Society for Catholic Action". This indefatigable laborer for Christ died in 1850 from a severe cold which he most likely caught on a cold rainy night after giving his cloak to a beggar who had none. **St. Vincent Pallotti, pray for us**
